Agri-Basic Corp.

The August 4 issue of the Amarillo Globe-Times carried a nice news story on the operations of Agri-Basic Corp., a firm begun in 1968 by W. T. Price III in Amarillo with four distinct subsidiaries, Sunripe, Plains Growers, Inc., Far-Tex Feedyards and Hoggard-Price Farms. Clyde Hoggard of Hedley is vice president of the corporation.

Of most interest here is Hoggard-Price Farms at Hedley, managed by Clyde Hoggard. This project began in 1968 when Price and Hoggard bought 870 acres of cottoned-out land near Hedley. After three years of operation and much root plowing, well drilling and cultivation, alfalfa is grown to the tune of five tons per acre.

When the farm was purchased mesquite brush covered the land and there was no water. The company has drilled seven irrigation wells and now totally irrigates the acreage, which produces five to seven cuttings of alfalfa each season.

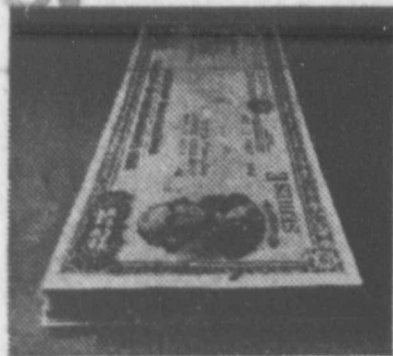

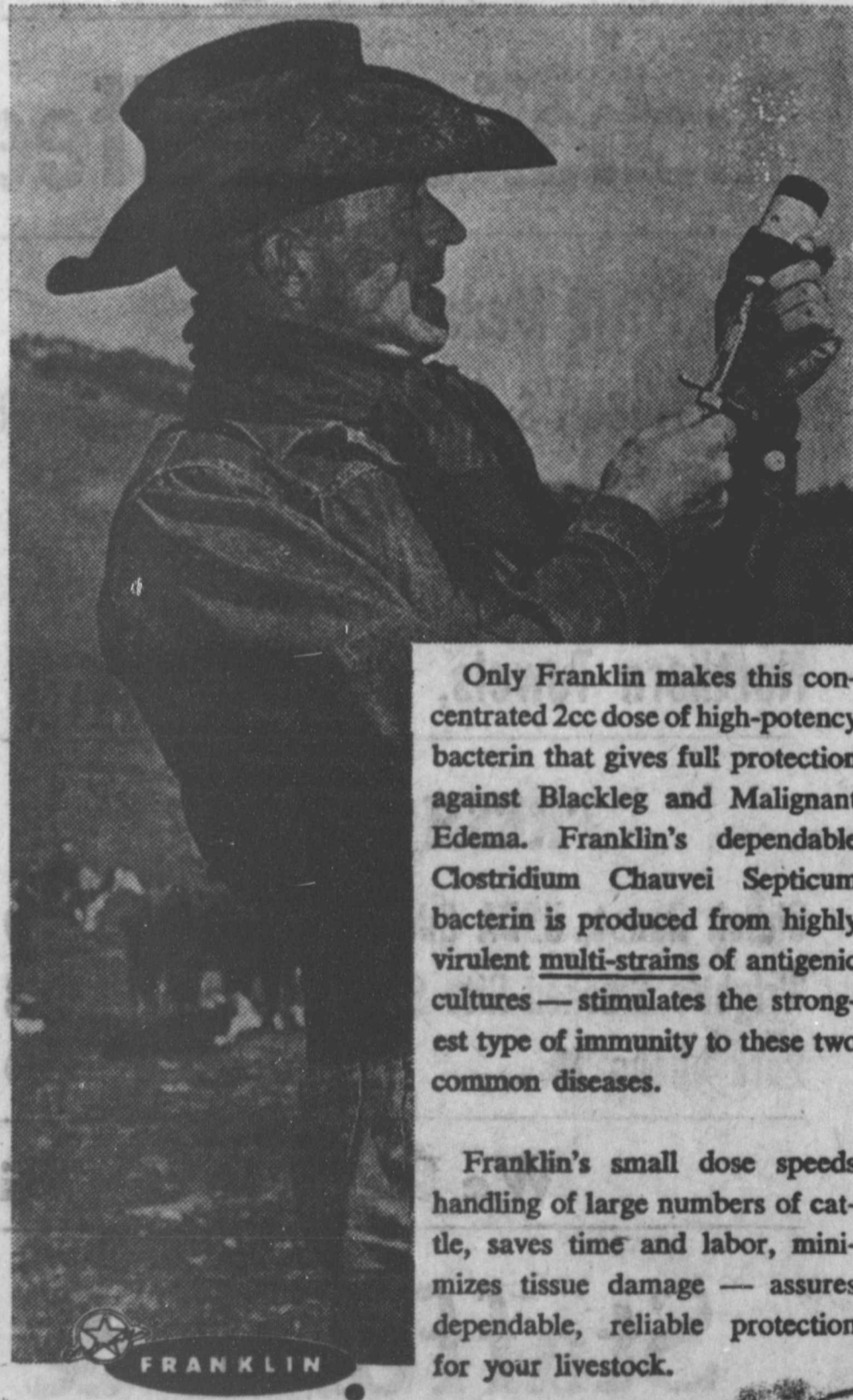
