





- * Demand for cotton is strong-domestic and foreign.
- * Failure to meet demand could jeopardize markets and the farmer's investment in land, equipment, and other production resources.
- *Higher yields spread overhead cost and reduce cost per pound.
- * Cutting harvesting losses can mean up to 10 per cent more cotton, or \$15 more per acre.
- * Better yields in 1971 can increase cotton färmers' yield for payment purposes in 1972 and 1973.
- * If sufficient cotton can be made available to meet demand, the

- way would be open to greater markets in the future.
- * Mill use of cotton depends heavily on its availability and price
- Strong demand for cotton corduroys, print cloths, denims, and knits has led some mills to shift to all-cotton. Prospects of a low carryover and uncertainty about supply and price could quickly drive these customers back to blends.
- *When the supply of cotton falls short, prices become non-competitive and mills turn to other fibers.




