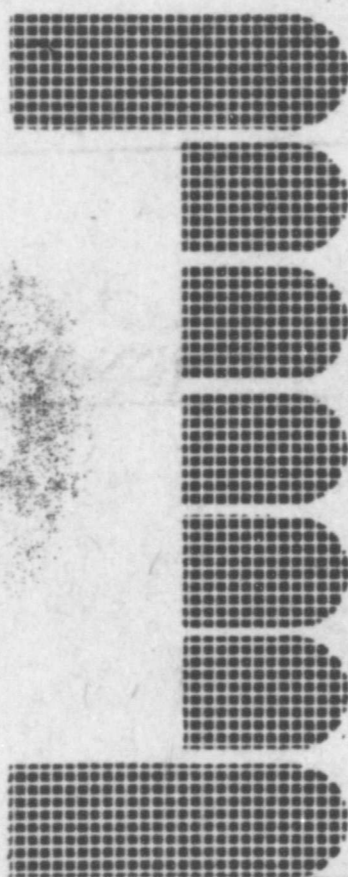

The cotton industry, U.S. Department of Agriculture, and agricultural Extension services in the 14 major cotton producing states are cooperating. Goal is to "increase producer net income and profits through increased yields and obtain an adequate supply of cotton to meet market needs at home and abroad."

- * Demand for cotton is strong—domestic and foreign.

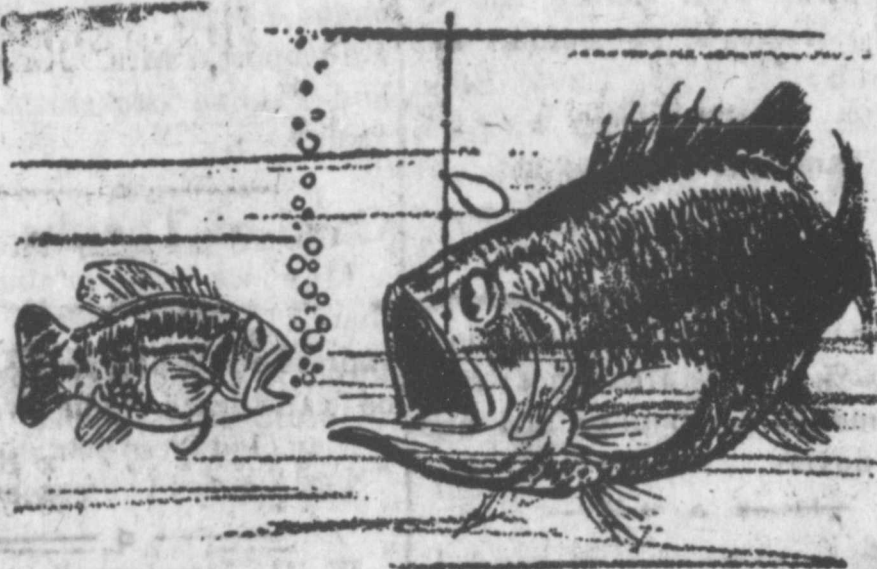

High School Basketball School Board Meeting

The Coyotes from Higgins took the measure of the Grinning Green Owls last Tuesday night. Linden Weese, an all district post man, led the Coyotes to a 58-53 triumph over the Owls. His 20 points topped Hedley's Shane Rieken by one. Leon Freeman hit 16, David Bolin 10.

As a team, the Owls hit only 30% from the floor and 38% at the free shot line, and were badly beaten on the boards by the shorter team. This made Hedley 2-1 for the year, and Higging 1-0.

Friday at Briscoe the Owls rode the Broncho for the full count and came away with victory No. 3. 69-62 Hedley's 69 points was shared by six boys, David Bolin with 24, Leon Freeman with 21, and Shane Rieken, who sat out about two quarters with many fouls, still got 15 points. Hollis Adams had 26 for Briscoe.

The Owls hit 50% from the floor, and 52% at the free shot line, gathered in 39 rebounds and had 24 turnovers.
