Mr. Deaver expressed his gratitude to friends and associates who have urged him to seek election to the District Attorney post, but points out that it has been an ambition of his to serve as District Attorney in this district since his early boyhood, and that he looks forward with enthusiasm to meeting and talking with the citizens of the 100th Judicial District during the course of his campaign.
