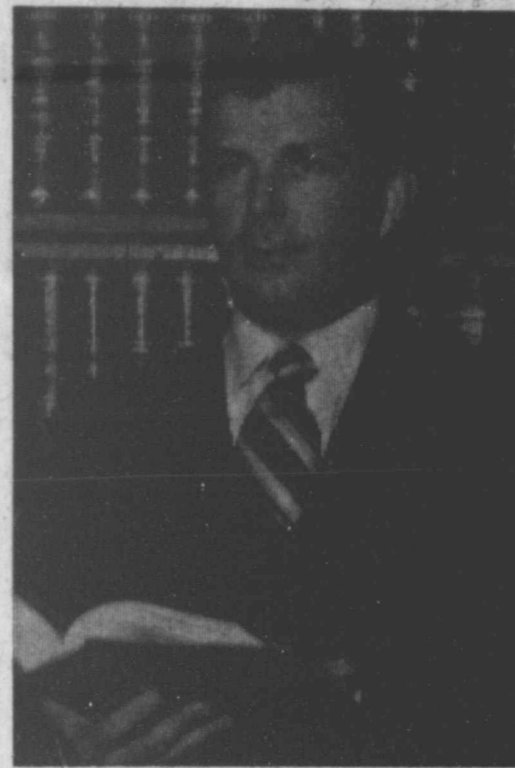

Jack Boone of Memphis, Texas, District Attorney of the 100th Judicial District, today announced that he is seeking re-election to that office. Mr Boone has held this office since August 1, 1968. The counties he serves are Childress, Collingsworth, Hall, Donley, and Carson.

Mr. Boone has released the following statement: "I sincerely appreciate being your District Attorney and earnestly want to serve you for another four years. The job has been tough, but enjoyable. It is a heavy responsibility to hold the outcome of people's lives when they face criminal charges. We have at all times represented the honest, law abiding people of this District, and not the criminal. We have excellent law enforcement officers in this District, and for their help I am grateful."

Mr Boone is active statewide in the Texas District Attorney's Association, and is now helping write the Texas Penal Code. He anticipates being a Texas delegate to the National District Attorneys' meeting in 1972.

Locally, he is active in numerous civic groups. He was also selected as one of the 1971 Outstanding Young Men of America. He, his wife Bebe and children Kathy and Marshall are members of the First Baptist Church of Memphis. Bebe is teaching in the Memphis Public Schools.

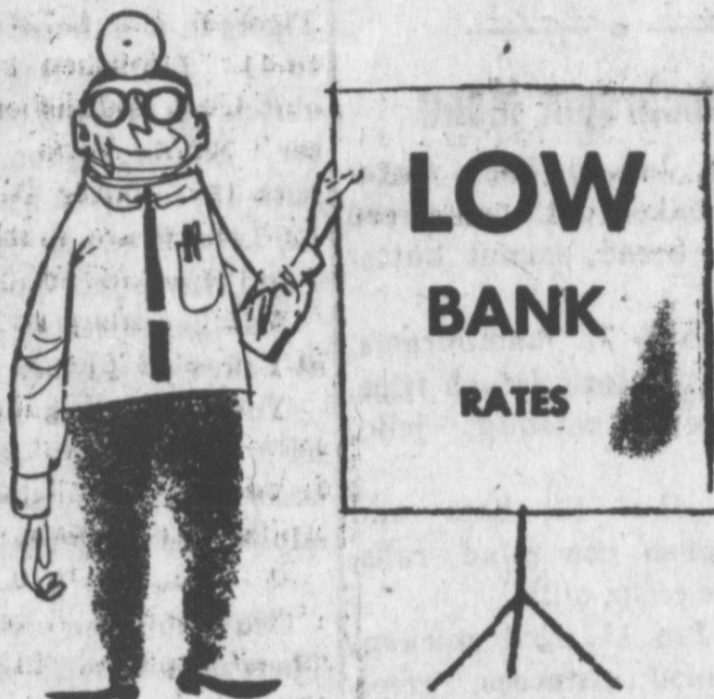
