Basketball News

Hedley disposed of their closest district competition last Friday by whipping the Turkey Turks at Turkey, 76 to 45

The Owls were led by David Bolin, who had a hot second quarter, scoring 13 of his 23 points in a six minute span. David had 20 rebounds to add to his night's work. Shane Rieken had 19 points and 8 rebounds. Leon Freeman 13 points and 19 rebounds, Daniel Bolin 13 points and 8 rebounds and Johnny Reynolds 6 points.

Terry Collins scored 2 points as the young Owls played most of the last six minutes. Raymond Woodard turned in a good defensive game but missed on six shots from the floor.

As a team Hedley hit 36 of 80 attempts from the floor and had 23 turnovers as they gave another good example of team play, feeding the open man on offense and helping each other on defense. Ten boys saw action in the game.

The Owls defeated the Groom Tigers 79 to 32 at Hedley as five players scored in double figures.

Hedley travels to Quitaque Friday night. This will be the last time to play in the small gym at Quitaque as they are merging with Turkey next school year.

Admission to all district games is \$1.00 for adults and 25¢ for students. The district tournament will be at Childress Feb. 10 and 11. Admission there will be \$1.00 for adults and 50¢ for students.

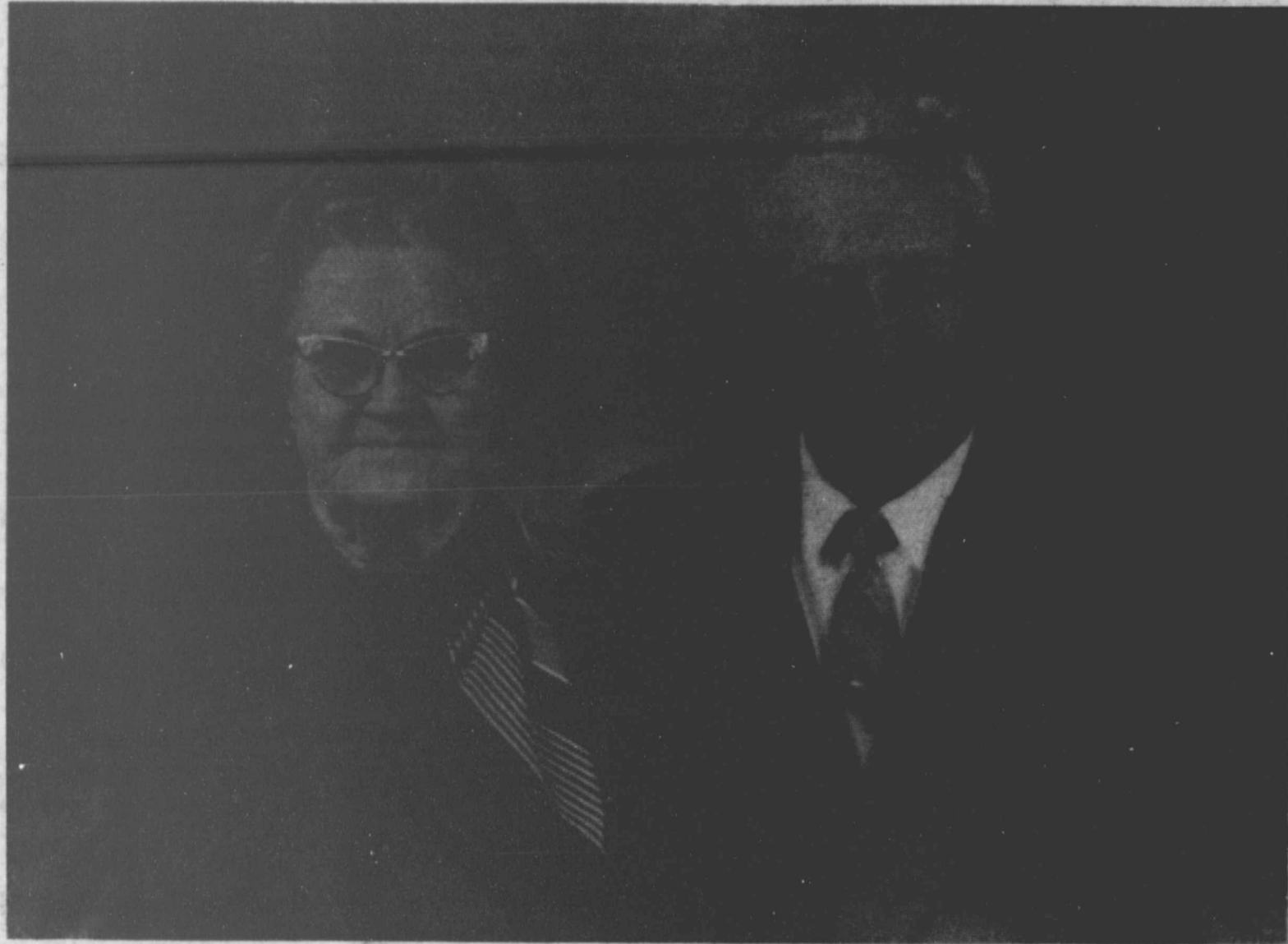

crops. An average productivity deduction rate will be used for each county with rates varying from \$6 to \$10.20 per acre.
