Joint School and City Election

In the school election here Saturday, 146 votes were cast. There were two trustees to elect, and four names on the ballot.

James Potts received 124 votes, J. D. Skaggs received 86, Kenneth Brinson 26 and Lewis Drum 23. T. E. Naylor received 42 write in votes. James Potts and J. D. Skaggs, incumbents, were returned to the board.

In the city election, 110 votes were cast. D. E. Boliver received 91 votes and there were several assorted write in votes. For Aldermen, C. L. Taylor received 95 votes, Henry Moore 93 votes and C. D. 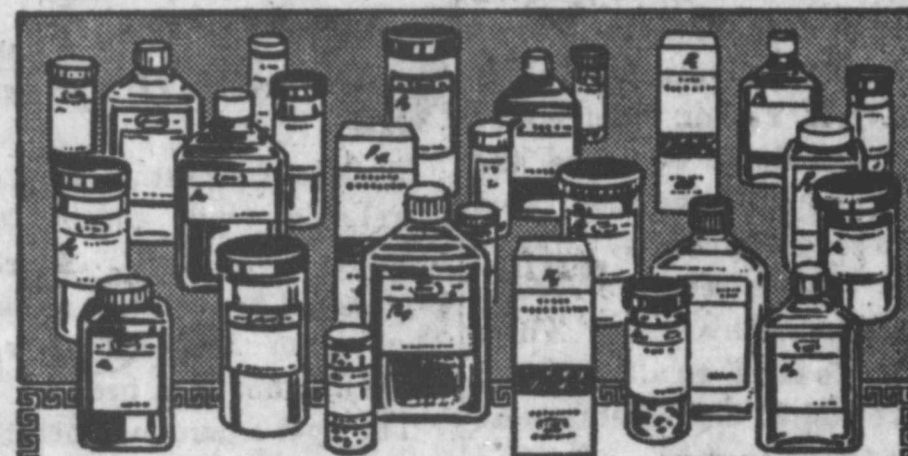

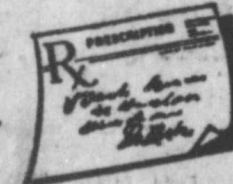



Austin—A contract for seal coat work on 74.2 miles of highways in the Childress district was awarded by the Texas Highway Commission during its March meeting here.

The work will be under the supervision of District Engineer V. J. McGee. The contract includes work in Briscoe, Dickens, Donley, Hall and Hardeman Counties.

Brannan Contractors, Inc. of Victoria was awarded contract with a low bid of \$252,703.40. The work will take an estimated 100 working days to complete. Arville Coyle of Childress is the Highway Department engineer in charge.

The portion in Donley includes 23,072 miles on RM 2695, from the Gray County line to St. 203, and 5,018 miles on FM 1260 from 5 miles north of US 287, east and north.
