2 Hedley FFA Teams Qualify for State Meet

The dairy products and dairy cattle judging teams won 2nd and 10th respectively, which qualifies them for competition in the state contest to be held in College Station April 29. Mr Messer's dairy products team from Quail placed 8th, and they too will compete at state level.

The dairy cattle team placed 4th in Area I in competition with 63 other teams in Area I. There were 105 teams in the regional contest. There were 48 teams judging dairy products. Hedley placed 2nd in both Area I and regional Monterey of Lubbock won 1st.

Davy Drum received a 6th place individual award in his contest and Leon Freeman received a 9th place. Terry Canada of Quail won a 3rd place medal. Joel Ross placed 8th.

In dairy cattle Terry Collins received a 5th place for judging Jerseys and Brown Swiss.

This contest also served as Greenbelt District's judging contest. In district Hedley won first in dairy products, first in dairy cattle, and 3rd in poultry.

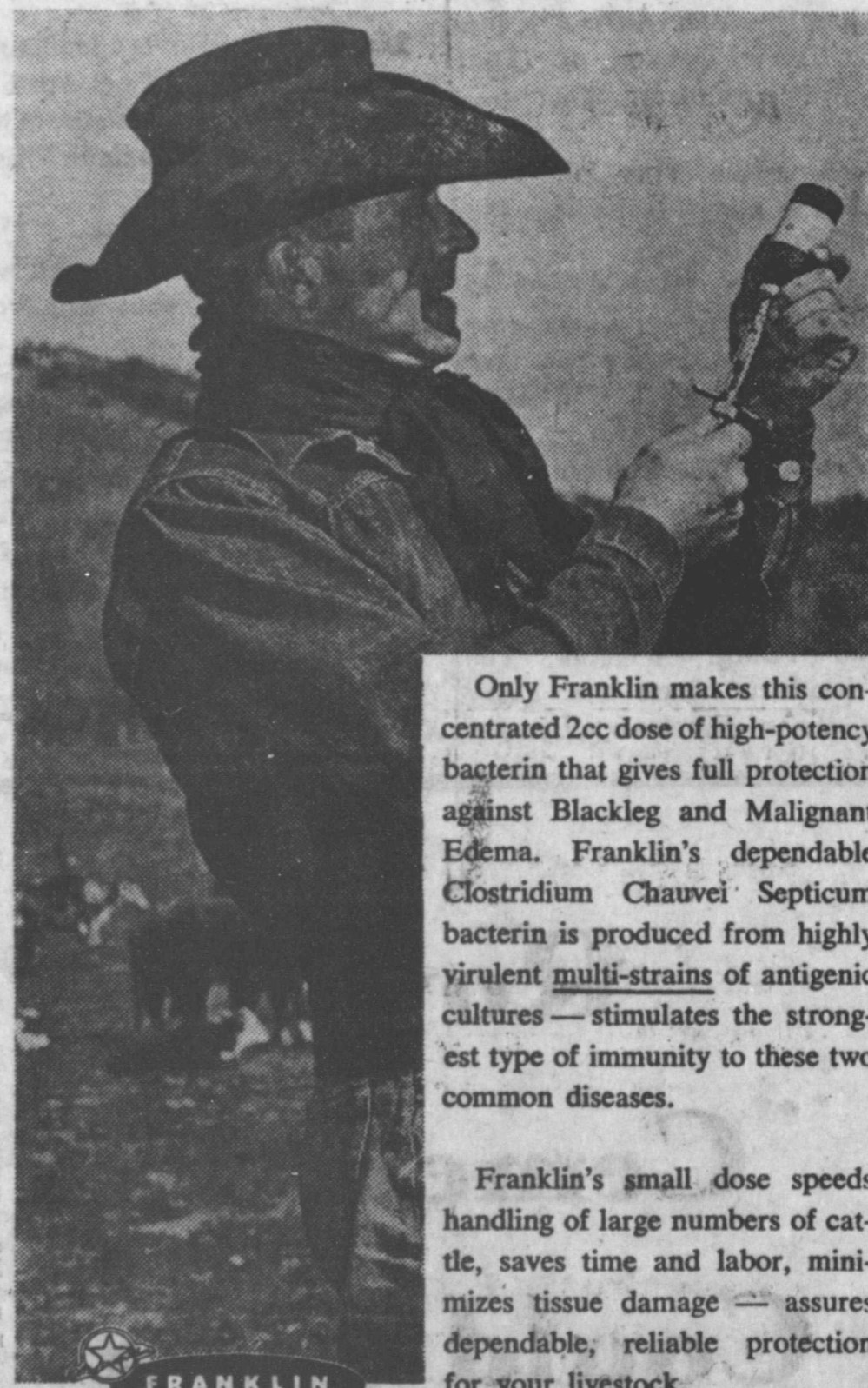

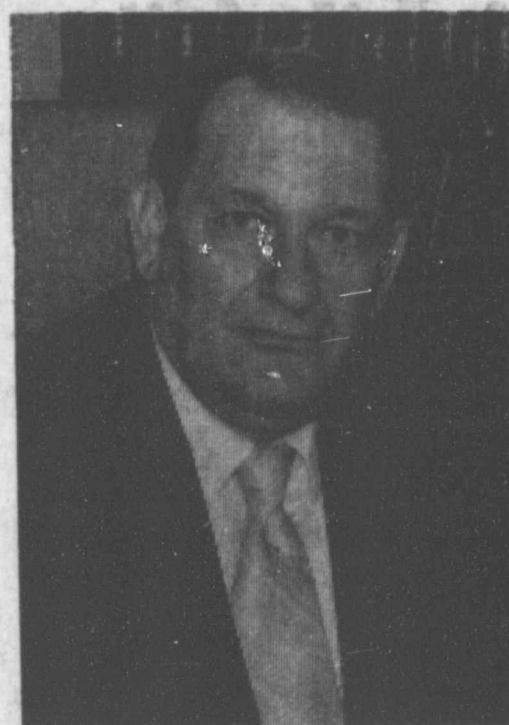

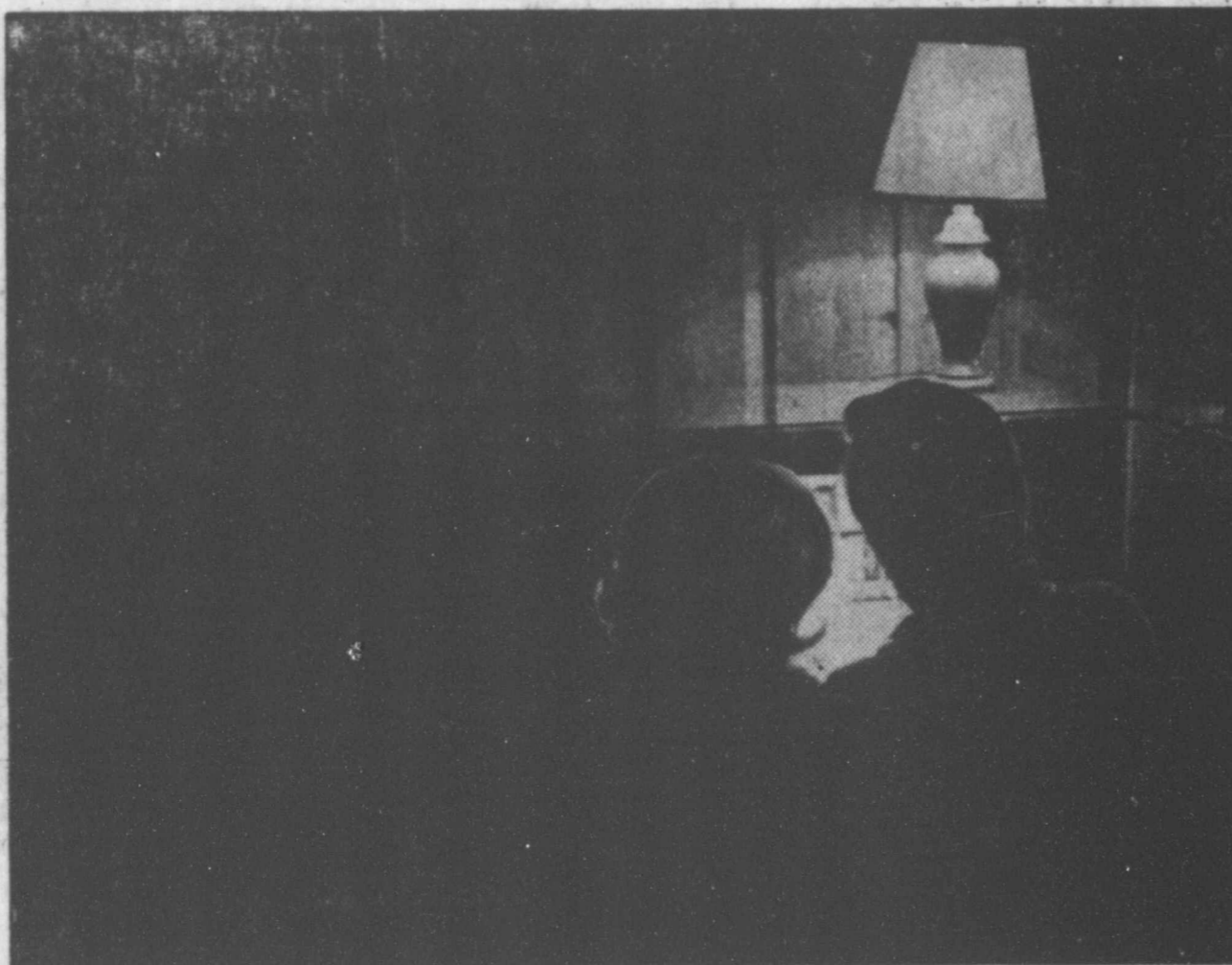
