Kathy Duke Places Third In State Ready Writing Contest



AN ORDINANCE CRANTING TO LONE STAR GAS COM-PANY, A CORPORATION, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, A FRANCHISE TO FURNISH AND SUPPLY GAS TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC IN THE CITY OF HEDLEY, DONLEY COUNTY, TEXAS, AND THE ENVIRONS THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE PAY-MENT OF A FEE OR CHAR-GE FOR THE USE OF THE STREETS, ALLEYS AND PUBLIC WAYS, AND PRO-VIDING THAT IT SHALL BE IN LIEU OF OTHER FEES AND CHARGES, EXCEPTING AD VALOREM TAXES; RE-PEALING ALL PREVIOUS GAS FRANCHISE ORDINAN-CES: AND PROVIDING FOR ACCEPTANCE BY THE COM-PANY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF HEDLEY, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City of Hedley, Texas, hereinafter called "City," hereby grants to Lone Star Gas Company, hereinafter called "Company," its successors and assigns, consent to use and occupy the present and future streets, alleys, highways, public places, public thoroughfares and grounds of City for the purpose of laying, maintaining, constructing, operating and replacing therein and thereon pipelines and all other appurtenant equipment needed and necessary to deliver and sell gas to persons, firms and corporations, including all the general public, within and beyond the City's corporate limits, said consent being granted for a term of twentyfive (25) years from and after the date of the final passage and approval of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. Company shall lay, maintain, contsruct, operate and replace its pipes, mains, laterals and other equipment so as to interfere as little as possible with traffic and shall promptly clean up and restore to an approximate original condition, at its cost, all thoroughfares and ot-

for. Company shall have the right to contract with each customer with reference to the installation of, and payment for, any and all of the gas piping from the connection thereof with the Company's main in the streets or alleys to and throughout the consumer's premises. Company shall own, operate and maintain all service lines, which are defined as the supply lines for the Company's main to the consumer's curt line when mains are located in the streets and to the consumer's property line when mains are located in the alleys. The consumer shall own, operate and maintain all yard lines and house piping. Yard lines are defined as the underground supply lines extending from the point of connection with Company's service line to the point of connection with consumer's house piping.

SECTION 5. Company shall not be required to extend mains on any street mroe than one hundred (100) feet for any one consumer of gas.

SECTION 6. Company shall be entitled to require from each and every consumer of gas, before gas service is commenced, a derosit of twice the amount of an estimated average monthly bill, which said deposit may be retained by Company until service is discontinued and all bills thereflor have been paid. Company shall then return said deposit to the consumer, together with six percent (6%) interest thereon from the date of said deposit up to the date of discontinuance of service. Company shall be entitled to apply said deposit, with accrued interest, to any indebtedness owed Company by the consumer making the deposit.

SECTION 7. The rights, privilegeas and franchises granted by this wrdinance are not to be considered exclusive, and City hereby expressly reserves the right to grant, at any time, like privileges, rights and franchises as it may see fit to any other person or corporation for the purpose of furnishing gas for light, heat and power to and for City and the inhabitants thereof. SECTION 8. Company shall furnish reasonably adequate service to the public at reasonable rates and charges therefor; and Company shall maintain its property, equipment and appliances in good order and condition. SECTION 9. Company, its successors and assigns, agrees to ray and City agrees to accept, on or before the 1st day of March, 1973, and on or before the same day of each succeeding year during the life of this franchise, up to and including the year 1997. a sum of money which shall be equivalent to two percent (2%) of the gross receipts received by Company from the sale of gas to its domestic and commercial consumers within the corporate limits of said City (expressly excluding, however, receipts derived from sales to industrial and governmental users and consumers in said City) for the preceding calendar year, which annual payment shall be for the right and privileges herein granted to Company including expressly, without limitation, the right to use the streets, alleys and public ways of said City. And it is also expressly agreed that the aforesaid annual payment shall be in lieu of any and all other and additional occupation taxes, easement

and franchise taxes, or charges (whether levied as an ad valorem, special or other character of tax or charge), in lieu of municipal license and inspection fees street taxes and street or alley rentals or charges, and all other and additional municipal taxes, charges, levies, fees and rentals of whatsoever kind and character which City may impose or hereafter be authorized to levy and collect, excepting only the usual general or special ad valorem' taxes, which City is authorized to levy and impose upon real and personal property. Should City not have the legal power to agree that the payment of the foregoing sums of money shall be in lieu of taxes, licenses, fees, street or alley rentals or charges, easement or franchise taxes or charges aforesaid, then City agrees that it will apply so much of said sums of money paid as may be necessary to satisfy Company's obligations, if any, to pay such taxes, licenses, charges, fees, rentals, easement or franchise taxes or charges.

In order to determine the gross receipts received by Company from the sale of gas (expressly excluding the sales of gas to industrial and governmental consumers) within the corporate limits of City, Company agrees that on the same date that payments are made as provided in the preceding paragraph of this Section 9, it will file with the City Clerk a sworn report showing the gross receipts received from the sale of gas to its domestic and commercial consumers within said corporate limits for the calendar year preceding the date of payment. City may, if it sees fit, have the books and records of Company examined by a representative of said City to ascertain the correctness of the sworn reports agreed to be filed herein.

Receipts from sales to governmental users or consumers shall include all those receipts derived from the sale of gas to federal, state, county or city governments or branches and subdivisions thereof, school districts or other similar districts, it being the intention to include within the term "governmental users, and consumers" all tax-supported institutions owned or operated directly or indirectly by said governments and branches or subdivisions thereof, such as schools, colleges, hospitals, eleemosynary institutions, army or training camps, airports, courthouse, City hall and other institutions of like or similar kind and character. "Industrial users or consu mers," as herein used, are those generally and commonly classified as such by Company. The payment herein provided shall be for the period January 1 to December 31 of the respective year that the payment is made. SECTION 10. The enactment of this franchise ordinance shall operate to repeal and nullify that certain Franchise Ordinance No. 26, dated June 13, 1927, and all amendments thereto recorded in the Minutes of the City Council and styled: AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO A. J. HARDENDORF, HIS AND ASSIGNS, A HEIRS FRANCHISE FOR THE PUR-POSE OF INSTALLING, MAINTAINING AND OF-ERATING A GAS DISTRI BUTING SYSTEM IN THE CITY OF HEDLEY, AND FIX-ING RATES TO BE CHARG-

ED; AND FURTHER AUT-HORIZING HIM OR HIS ASS-IGNS TO MANUFACTURE ARTIFICIAL GAS AND DIS-TRIBUTE IT, AND FIXING THE DUTIES OF THE GRAN-TEE, AND PROVIDING RE-STRICTIONS AND LIMITA-TIONS.

as extended by Ordinance, dated February 5, 1953, recorded in the Minutes of the City Council and styled:

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO THE CITY GAS COM-PANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, AN EXTENSION OF THE EXPIRATION DATE OF THE PRESENT FRANCHISE IT HAS FOR THE CON-STRUCTION AND OPERAT-ION OF A GAS DISTRIBUT-ING PLANT OR SYSTEM IN THE CITY 'OF' HEDLEY, DONLEY COUNTY, TEXAS. FOR A TERM OF TWENTY YEARS FROM THE EXPIRA-TION DATE OF SUCH PRE-SENT FRANCHISE AND MAK-ING THE EXPIRATION DATE THEREOF TWENTY YEARS FROM AND AFTER THE EX-PIRATION DATE OF THE PRESENT FRANCHISE OWN-ED BY SUCH CITY GAS COMPANY, IN THE CITY OF HEDLEY, DONLEY COUNTY, TEXAS, AND RATIFYING, ADOPTING AND CONFIRM. ING THE PRESENT CITY GAS COMPANY GAS FRAN-CHISE IN ALL RESPECTS INCLNDING SUCH EXTENS-ION HEREIN GRANTED.

The enactment of this franchise ordinance and the repeal of the aforesaid franchise ordinance, as amended and extended, shall not affect the rates and charges presently being charged by Gran tee for natural gas and natural gas service in the City of Hedley.

SECTION 11. Company shall file its written acceptance of this franchise ordinance within sixty (60) days after its final passage and approval by said City.

PASSED AND APPROVED on

her surfaces which it may disturb. The location of all mains, pipes, laterals and other appurtenant equipment shall be fixed under the supervision of the City Council or an authorized committee or agent appointed by said Council.

SECTION 3. Whe nCompany shall make or cause to be made excavations or shall place obstructions in any street, alley or other public place, the public shall be protected by barriers and lights placed, erected and maintained by Company; and in the event of injury to any person or damage to any property by reason of the construction, operation or maintenance of the gas distributing plant or system of Company, Company shall indemnify and keep harmless City from any and all liability in connection . therewith. Company shall repair, clean up and restore to an approximate original condition all streets and alleys disturbed during the construction and repair

of its gas distributing system. SECTION 4. In addition to the rates charged for gas supplied, Company may make and enforce reasonable charges, rules and regulations for service rendered in the conduct of its business, including a charge for service rendered in the inauguration of natural gas service, and may require, before furnishing service, the execution of a contract therethis the 6th day of April A. 

Three blasts do not necessarily indicate that a tornado has been sighted, but they do mean that everyone should watch the clouds and take whatever action seems to be necessary.








