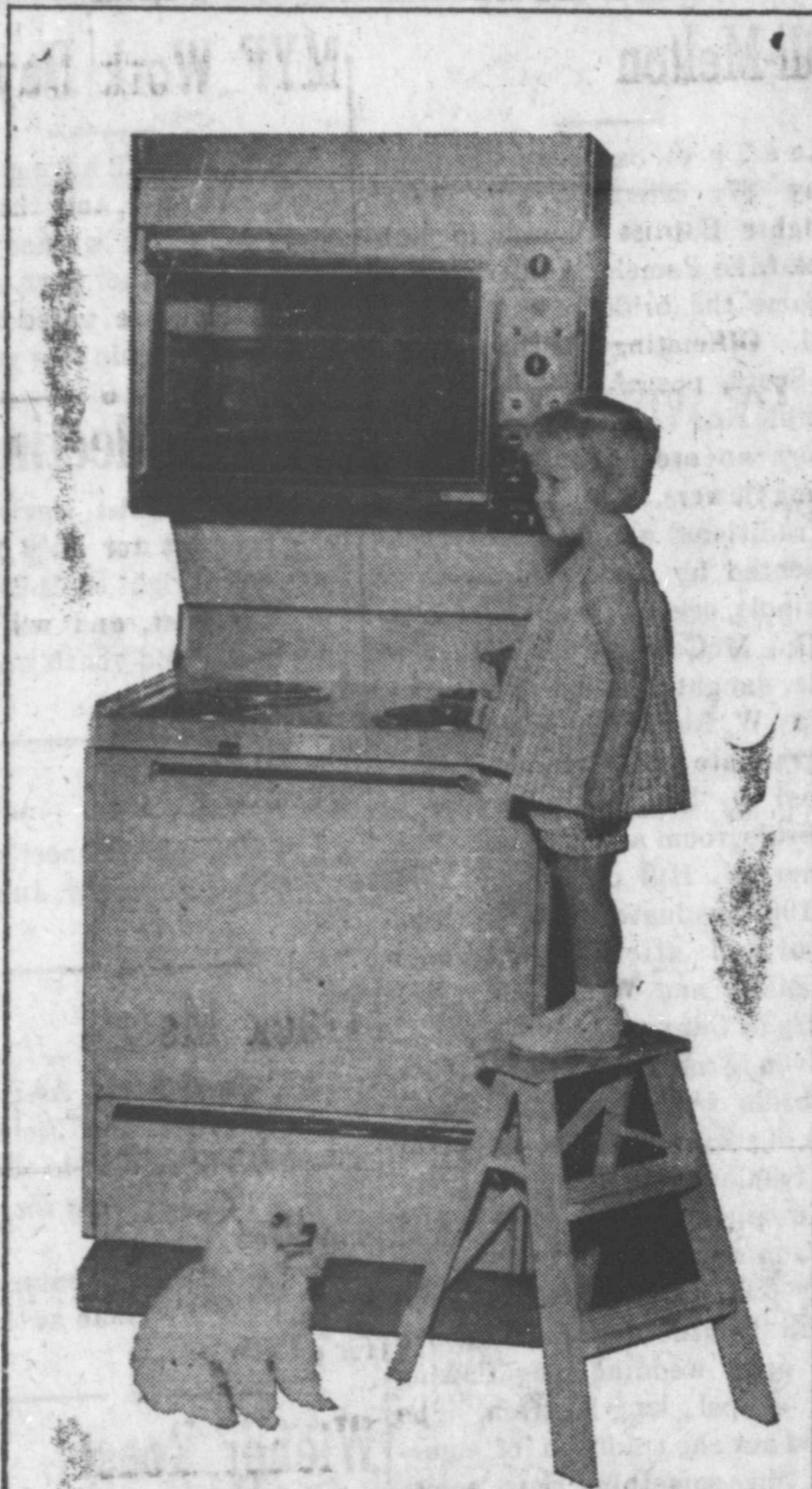

Legal Notice

An Ordinance Fixing and Determining the General Service Rate To Be Charged for Sales of Natural Gas To Residential and Commercial Consumers Within the City Limits of Hedley, Donley County, Texas, and Provide for the Manner in Which Such Rate May Be Changed, Adjusted and Amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HEDLEY, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Effective with the first gas bills rendered from and after thirty (30) days from the date of final passage of this ordinance, the maximum general service rate for sales of natural gas rendered to residential and commercial consumers within the city limits of Hedley by Lone Star Gas Company, a Texas corporation, its successors and assigns, is hereby fixed and determined as follows:

First 1,000 cu. ft. or fraction thereof \$2.444 Gross; \$2.20 Net
 Next 3,000 cu. ft. @ \$.956 per Mcf Gross; \$.86 per Mcf Net
 Next 6,000 cu. ft. @ .856 per Mcf Gross; .77 per Mcf Net
 Next 15,000 cu. ft. @ .789 per Mcf Gross; .71 per Mcf Net
 Next 75,000 cu. ft. @ .744 per Mcf Gross; .67 per Mcf Net
 All Over 100,000 cu. ft. @ .722 per Mcf Gross; .65 per Mcf Net
 No gas bill will be rendered to any residential or commercial consumer served under the above rate not consuming any gas during any monthly billing period.

ADJUSTMENTS

The amount of each net monthly bill computed at the above-stated rates shall be subject to the following adjustments: Plus or minus the amount of any increase or decrease, respectively, above or below the 42.5 cents per Mcf level in the intracompany city gate charge as authorized by the Railroad Commission of the State of Texas or other regulatory body having jurisdiction for gas delivered to Lone Star Gas Company's distribution system for sale to residential and commercial consumers where such changes are caused by increases or decreases in the cost of gas purchased by the Company; plus an amount equivalent to the proportionate part of any new tax, or increased tax, or any other governmental imposition, rental, fee or charge (except state, county, city and special district ad valorem taxes and taxes on net income) levied, assessed or imposed subsequent to April 1, 1972, upon or allocable to the Company's distribution operations, by any new or amended law, ordinance or contract. Each gross monthly bill shall be adjusted proportionately. Company, at its option, may forego the application of any adjustment if such

adjustment would result in an increase in the monthly bill; however, failure of Company to apply any adjustment shall not constitute a waiver of Company's right from time to time, or at any time, to make any adjustment, in whole or in part, in any subsequent current monthly bill that may be applicable to such bill.

Net rate shall apply to all bills paid within ten days from monthly billing date; gross rate shall be applicable thereafter.

The above rate is applicable to each residential and commercial consumer per meter per month or for any part of a month for which gas is used at the same location.

In addition to the aforesaid rates, Company shall have the right to collect such reasonable charges as are necessary to conduct its business and to carry out its reasonable rules and regulations in effect.

SECTION 2. The rate set forth in Section 1 may be changed and amended by either the City or Company furnishing gas in the manner provided by law. Service hereunder is subject to the orders of regulatory bodies having jurisdiction, and to the Company's Rules and Regulations currently on file in the Company's office.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that the meetings at which this ordinance was passed were open to the public, as required by Texas law, and that advance public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meetings was given, and that this rate ordinance is in compliance with the applicable general criteria issued by the Price Commission under the Economic Stabilization Act of 1970, as amended.

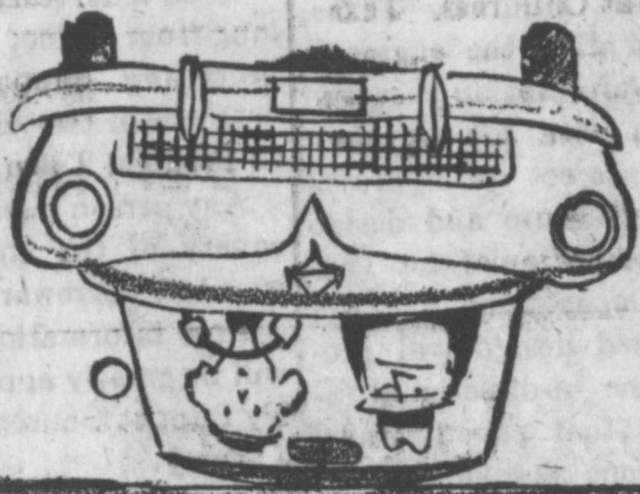

City To Pay More For Greenbelt Water

Beginning with the new fiscal year July 1st, the City of Hedley will be paying the Greenbelt Water Authority \$1176 per month for water, an increase of \$146 per month over the present rate of \$1030. An increase is being made on all the cities in the Authority to take care of bond payments.

The Hedley city council is hoping to make the increased payments without raising the price of water to the consumers. Hedley now has one of the best rates in the Authority for the consumer.

Our present rates are a minimum of \$6.00 for the first 2,000 gallons, 50¢ per thousand for the next 10,000, 40¢ per thousand for the next 10,000, and 30¢ per thousand for all over 22,000 gallons. This rate was designed to make the minimum as low as possible and still make the payments, and to make the rate on additional water cheap enough for everybody.

"Legal Notice" Notice of Highway Construction

The Texas Highway Department offered an opportunity for a public hearing to be requested by publication on May 18th and May 25th 1972, of a notice reporting the proposed construction of F. M. Road 3257, extending from U. S. Highway 287, 2.0 miles Northwest of Clarendon, North a distance of 3.2 miles, in Donley County.

No requests for a public hearing were received; therefore, the District Office of the Texas Highway Department, at Childress, Texas, has submitted all of the engineering data and information received in connection with the development of this project for approval of the proposed route and design by the Administration of the Texas Highway Department.

The proposed design will provide a two lane bi-directional facility with 10-foot paved travel lanes and 4-foot shoulders on a minimum right of way width of 100 feet. There will be no relocations on the proposed project.

Maps, drawings showing geometric design, environmental studies, and all other available data concerning the development of this project may be inspected and copied at the office of E. H. Monroe, Clarendon, Texas.

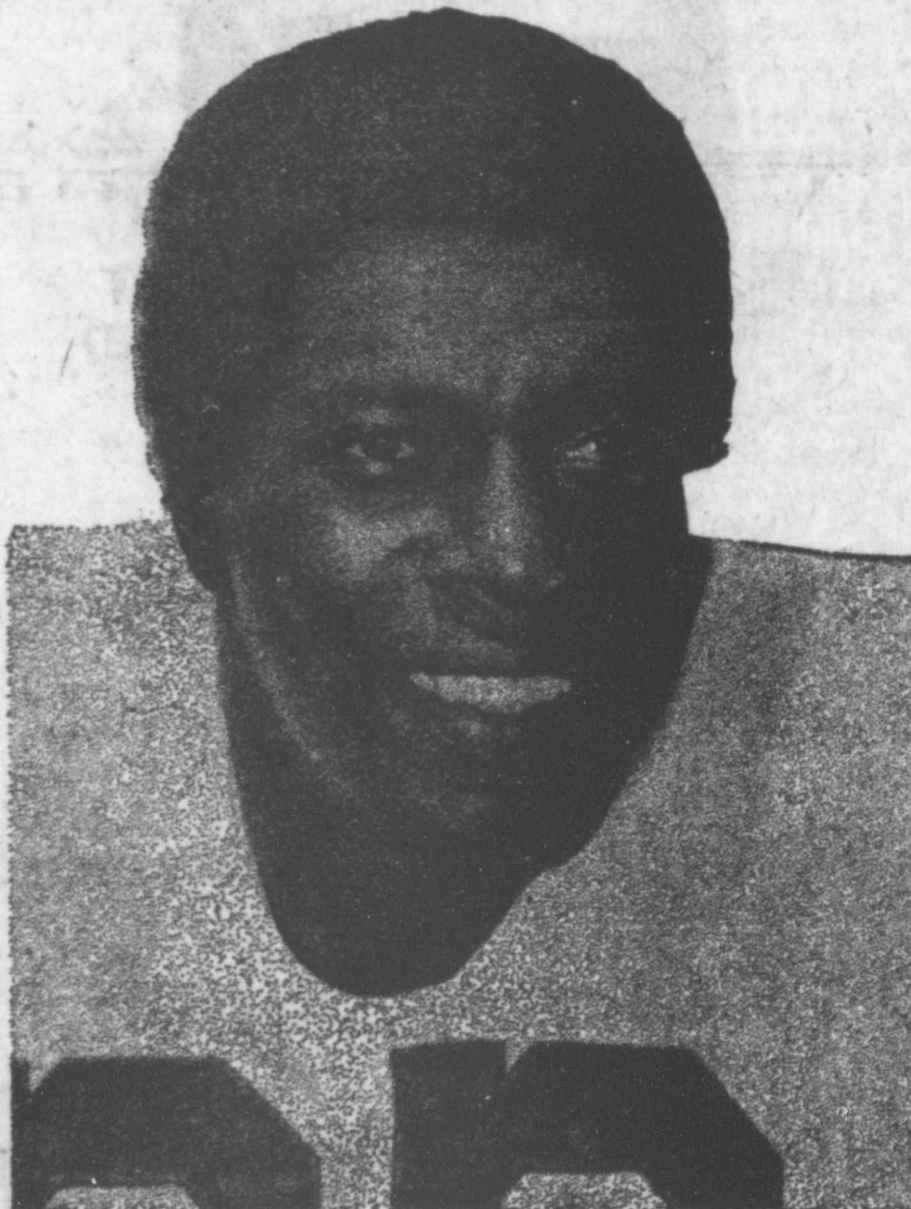
