## Receives Scholarship To Wed August 12

Austin, Texas—More than 130 Texas high school graduates have been named recipients of scholarships by the University of Texas Interscholastic League Foundation.

In order to be eligible for the scholarships the students must have graduated during the current academic year, have competed in State Meet literary or academic contests and must have submitted College Entrance Examination Board scores or the equivalent.

Among those named was Kathleen Duke of Hedley, a \$750 Clark Foundation scholarship to McMurry College.

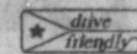
