WTU Granted Small **Rate Increase**

At regular City Council meet ing last Thursday night, the West Texas Utilities Co was granted a six per cent rate increase in their residential, commercial and industrial rates This was the first general rate increase in the company's 50 year history.

The company was represented by local manager Allen Estlack and James Elam

The increase will not apply to minimum bills, fuel adjustments municipal rates and power interchanges with other companies "As a result," Mr Estlack said, ' the increase in the company's total revenue will be less than five percent "

The increase will add about 23 cents per day to the average residential bill, according to Mr Estlack He pointed out that since 1952 the average residential cost has dropped from 3 64 cents per kilowatt hour to 2 59 cents, a decrease of 29 percent During the same time the average residential times.
