Canyon, Tex.—Tanya Ruth White, Hedley High School senior, has been selected to play in the Third Annual Panhandle Girls' High School All-Star Basketball Game March 24 in Amarillo.

The All Star game precedes the championship contest of the Fifth Annual Amarillo National Women's Invitational Tournament. Game time is 7:05 p. m. in the Amarillo Civic Center Coliseum.

Miss White, a 5-7 guard, will represent the East team. A four-year letterman, Miss White averaged five rebounds and five steals per game.

Miss White was an All-District second team selection in 1971 and 1972.

Only seniors are eligible for the all-star game which matches 14 member teams representing the East and West of the Texas Panhandle.

Miss White, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harold White, received a further honor last week end when she was named a guard on the second team of the all-state girls' Class B basketball team.

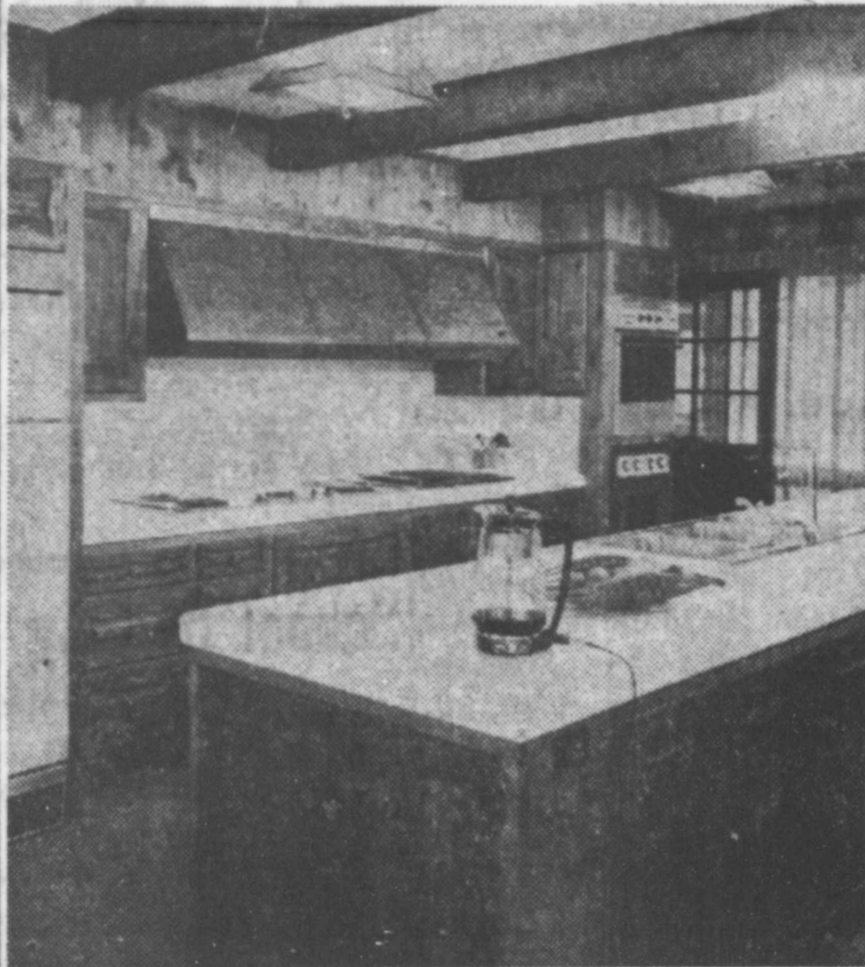

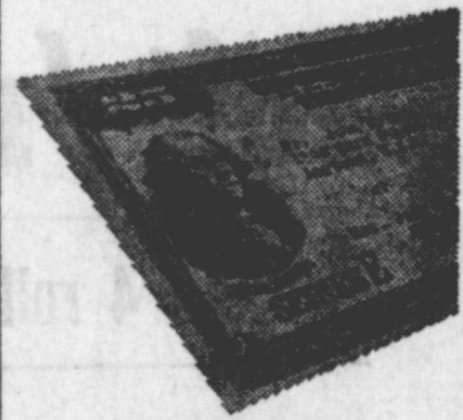
