## Linda Cooper Wins KVII Award

On July 3, 1973 in Borger, Mrs. Linda Cooper, formerly Linda Dickson, was presented a KVII-TV Pro News Good Guy Award. She received this for her life-saving effort in helping rescue and administer first aid treatment to a 7 year old girl from Borger.

She and Mike Crawford of Borger were nominated for the award by Police Lieutenant Jehn J. O'Brien in a letter that read: "May 31, 1973, the department received a call regarding a drowning at a private pool in this city. On arrival of this officer, it was found that a seven year old girl had in some way gained entrance to the pool and had been found floating on the bottom.

Mike dove into the pool and recovered the girl. Mrs. Linda Cooper applied mouth to mouth resuscitation to the child. Their combined actions averted what could have been a tragedy and deserves recognition in the spirit of a "Good Guy Award."

The Pro News Department, after receiving the letter agreed that Mrs. Cooper and Mike Crawford are most deserving of the life saving award.

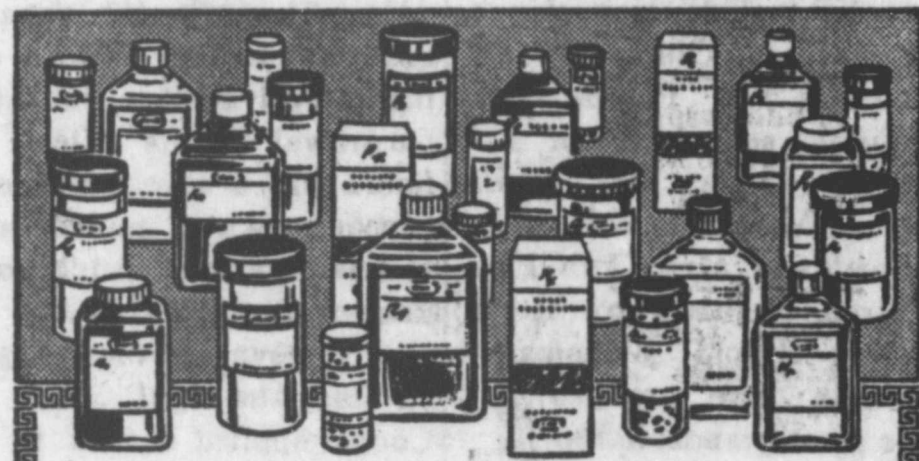

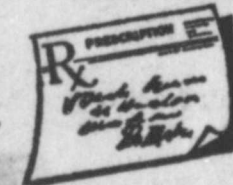

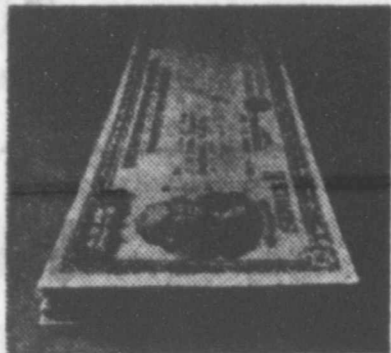
