## Feed Lot To Hold Open House July 28

The Donley County Feed Lot, Inc., is celebrating the opening of their Feed Batch Plant with an open house on Saturday, July 28th. They plan to have a free beef barbecue, musical entertainment and a tour of their greatly expanded facilities. The open house will be from 1:00 to 6:00 p. m.

State Rep. Phil Cates will give the opening address. A western band will play while the guests enjoy the barbecue under the trees.

Officers of the business are Charles Payne president, Billy Clubb vice president and manager, and Farris Martin asst manager.

The feed lot, which began in 1968, now has a capacity of about 8,000 head, and employs 23 persons. They expect to expand their capacity to about 20,000 head in around three weeks. Their new mill will have the capacity for around 50,000 head of cattle.

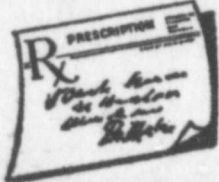

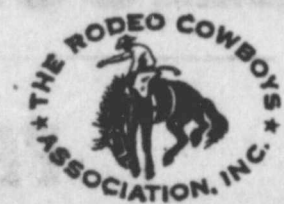
