

sounded by the fire siren. One blast of the siren indicates a fire, two blasts are to call the department together, and three blasts indicate a storm.


Three blasts do not necessarily indicate that a tornado has been sighted, but they do mean that everyone should watch the clouds and take whatever action seems to be necessary.

#### State Brush and Range Field Day

A Statewide Brush Control and cards, flowers and food, during Range Improvement Field Day will be held at Vernon on Oct. 4: The field day will feature a tour of the historic Waggoner Ranch in the morning (full tour at 8 a. m. short tour at 9:30 a. m.) and a program on brush control research in the Wilbarger Memorial Auditorium at 1:30 p.m. The Texas Agricultural Experiment Station has conducted brush research on the ranch since 1941, according to C.
