Security State Bank To Hold Open House

The Security State Bank will hold open house from 10:00 to 11:00 a. m. on Saturday, Oct. 13, in observance of the bank's 60th anniversary. Refreshments will be served, and they urge all their customers and friends to pay them a visit at the stated time.

In the early part of 1913 a group of citizens decided that they wanted a bank to take care of the needs of the community. They applied for a charter to open a bank in Hedley and received their charter from the state on June 21, 1913. Under the name of Guaranty State Bank, they were open for business on Aug. 22, 1913. The original capital of the bank was \$15,000.

The assets of the First State Bank were purchased in 1929 and the two institutions were merged under the name of Security State Bank. The capital was then raised to \$85,000.

Under the present management the bank has done remarkably well. Capital is now \$140,000, surplus \$84,000, and undivided profits and reserves over \$51,000, making a total capital structure of over \$275,000. Deposits total over \$3,000,000.

The community is indeed fortunate to be served by such a strong bank.

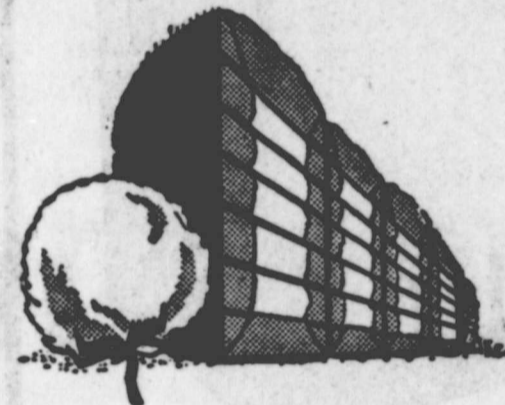

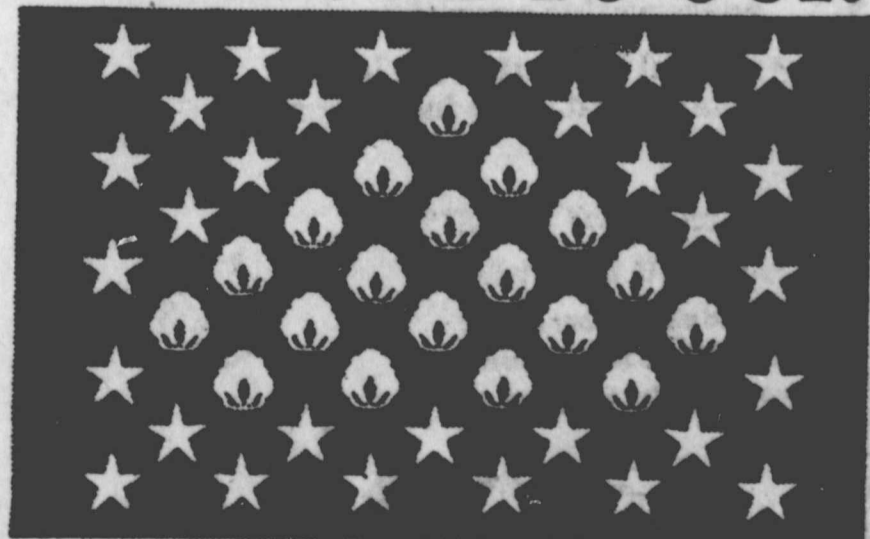

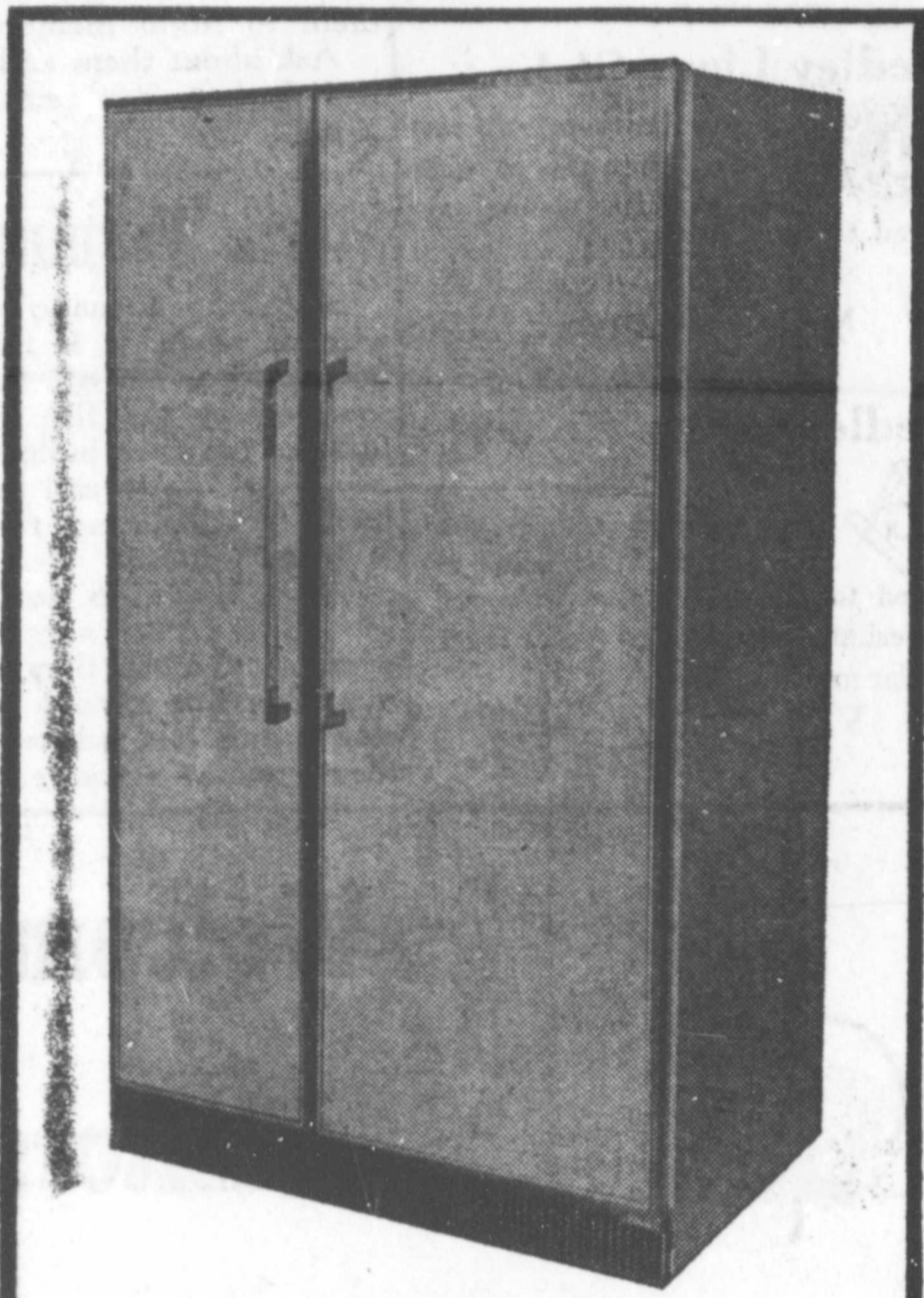
