Miss Rasco Marks 50 Years of Music



Fifty years ago in September, Miss Gertrude Rasco of Memphis began her career as a music teacher, realizing a dream which began when she was in the third grade. The first four years were in Hedley, from 1924 to 1928, then two years at Plaska, then from 1930 to 1943 at Brownfield.

She came to Memphis in 1943 and has taught there since that time. During her fifty years of teaching her students have ranged in age from four to sixty years.

She has been included in the World Who's Who of Musicians, published in Cambridge, England, and has served as a judge for the National Guild auditions in Texas and Oklahoma.
