Basketball News


The Hedley junior high girls traveled to Lakeview Tuesday night. We came up short by s score of 26 to 16. Sherrie Hill was high with 12.

On Friday we traveled to Channing and managed to defeat them 55 to 41. Both teams played poorly, but they finally played worse. Shauna White was again high with 27 points.




