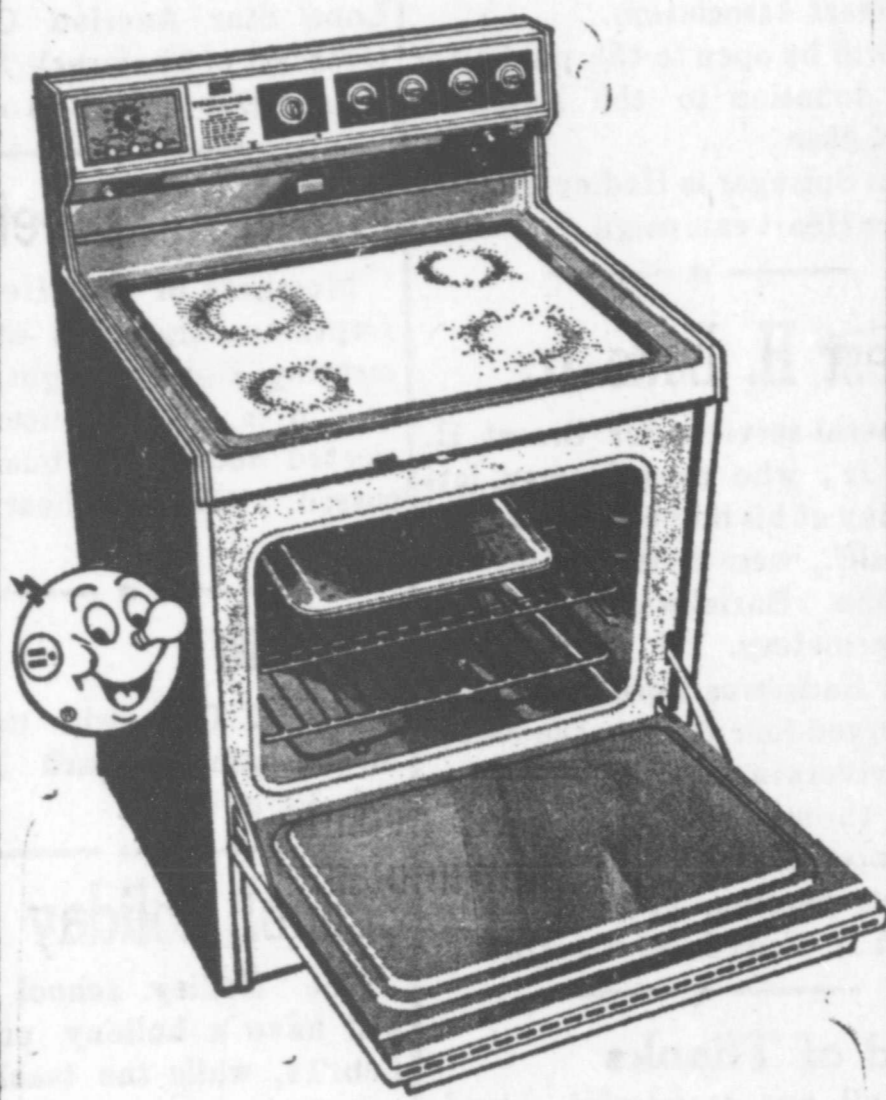

Reddy's helpful tips for your Electric Range



BAKING. Plan your oven meals. A complete meal can be cooked in the oven as economically as one food item. Get foods into the oven as soon as it's preheated - or don't preheat at all.

BOILING. When cooking vegetables, use a small amount of water. It takes less time to bring them to a boil. As soon as water reaches the boiling point, you can cut the setting back. 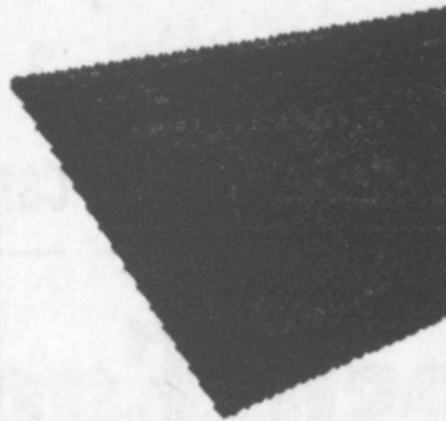


