
This month's meeting of Adamson-Lane post was cancelled due te bad weather and lack of attendance. The meeting will be Mar. 7. A free supper will be served.

The post membership is now 66. However 7 of last year's members have not paid their dues for 1975. The post's aim is 75 members for 1975.


