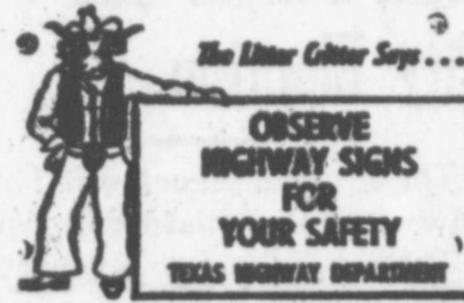

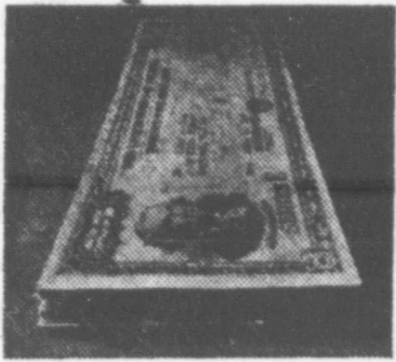

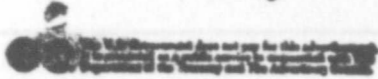

Free shots will be given children at the new housing project in Memphis on Feb. 20. There must be a card for each child showing the shots he has had or lacks, and the parents' permission for shots.

There should be three shots for polio, three DPT or DT. Children through age 11 need measles and rubella vaccine.

If polio and DPT were given before age 4 you need a booster, and every ten years a booster for DT!
