## David Baker Honored License Plates To Be Sold Here

David L. Baker, Audit Supervisor with Peat, Marwich, Mitchell & Co., is listed in the 1975-76 edition of "Who's Who in the South and Southwest." His name will also appear in "Who's Who in America" and refer to his biographical sketch in "Who's Who in the South and Southwest."

The publication is a compilation of biographical data on outstanding citizens of this geographical area. "To be selected, a person must have accomplished some conspicuous achievement, something that distinguishes him from the vast majority of his contemporaries."
