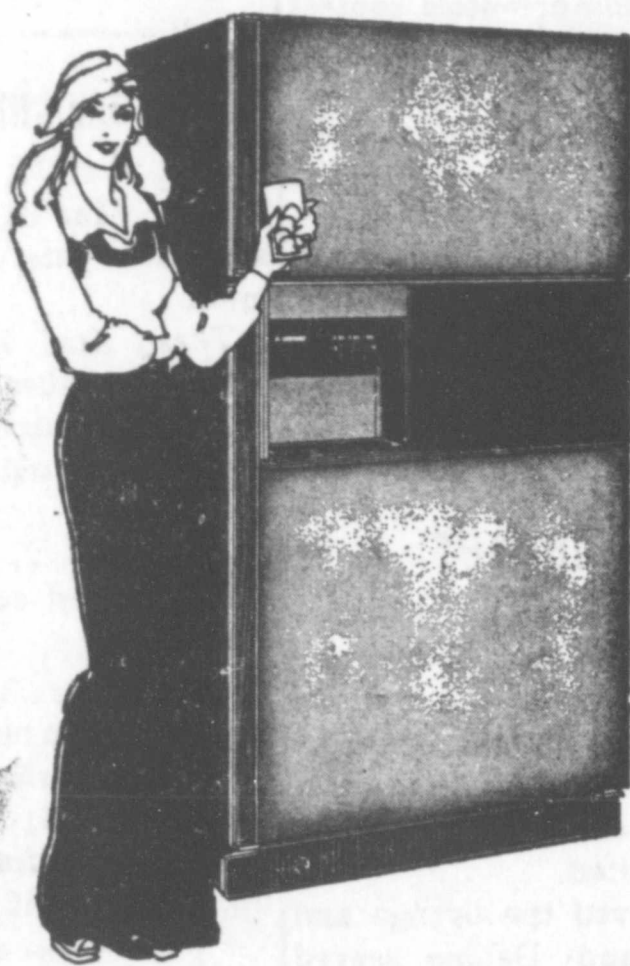

## REDDY'S REFRIGERATOR SAVINGS TIPS



Don't open refrigerator door unnecessarily. Plan your trips to the refrigerator while cooking. Make sure the children maintain a closed-door policy.

Buy the size that fits your needs. An over-large refrigerator or freezer wastes space as well as electricity.

Clean external coils, fins and motor often and keep them free from dust.

Defrost your refrigerator and freezer before ice deposit exceeds 1/4 inch. Excess ice causes your refrigerator to work harder.

### Cleaning

#### Inside of cabinet

- a. Should be cleaned twice a month
  - dispose of forgotten foods
  - clean up spillovers
  - eliminate "off" odors that transfer flavors
- b. Use warm water and baking soda solution. (2 teaspoon soda to 1 quart water). Rinse in clear water and dry.

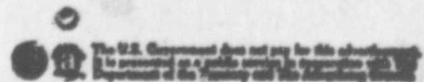

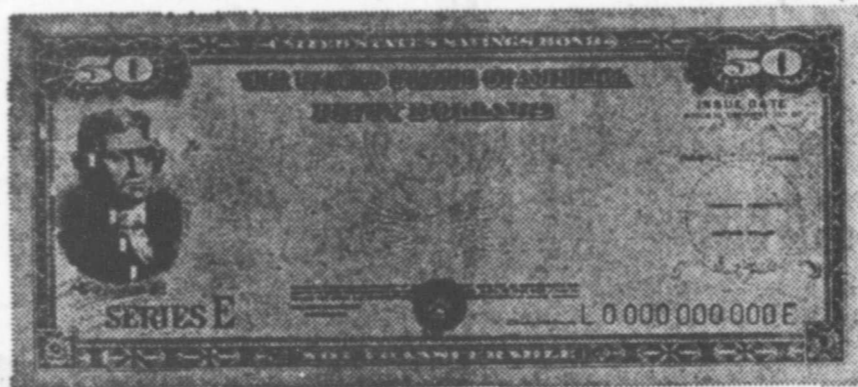
