## Cosby Visits India

Rev. Stan Cosby spent the month of January in India on a travel seminar sponsored by Asbury Theological Seminary, Wilmore, Kentucky, where he is a student. From Jan. 5 to 30 he and 16 others from Asbury visited Delhi, Varanasi, Bombay and Belguam, India, and Katmandu, Nepal. Dr. J. T. Seamands, Professor of Christian Missions at Asbury Seminary and missionary to India from 1941 to 1961, led the tour.

The purpose of this unusual study-travel experience was twofold: to become acquainted with the Indian culture and to observe the church in India and Nepal. Each city on the itinerary served these purposes. The touring group saw first-hand some of the hunger problems which trouble India, also they became vividly aware of the spiritual starvation there, a dilemma which compounds the problem of hunger and other wasting of human life and resources.
