Summer Homemaking Classes

Classes to be offered immediately following the close of the regular school term include a week's classes for high school students and five three hour classes for adults

Classes for students will be the week of May 26 to 30 from 9:00 to 11:30 a m Each student must attend the group sessions for a minimum of six hours, complete an extensive project during the summer and hand in a written report on the summer work at the beginning of the fall term Students completing the assignment satisfactorily will earn one-half credit toward graduation. The students will work on clothing construction, furniture refinishing and some craft work

The adult class will be demonstrations by the instructor, basically quick and easy methods of sewing with knits This will include special techniques and will include men's wear.
