## Legal Notice

The Commissioners' Court of Donley County, Texas, will sit as an Equalization Board on Monday August 11, 1975, at 1:00 o'clock P. M., in the courthouse in Clarendon, Texas. This will be for a second hearing and any one desiring may appear before the Board.

The Court is proposing a \$2.00 increase per acre on farm and ranch land. The total tax increase on one section (640 acres) of land will be \$19.33 without the homestead exemption. On less number of acres, the tax will be less, accordingly.

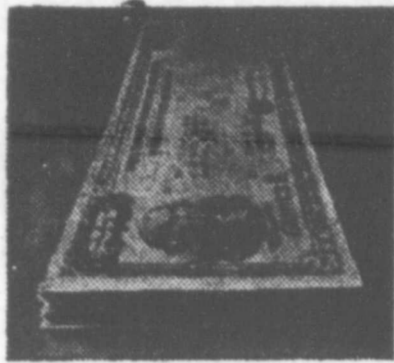

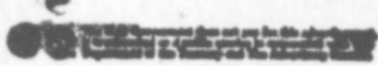

# They laughed when I bought my first Bond.

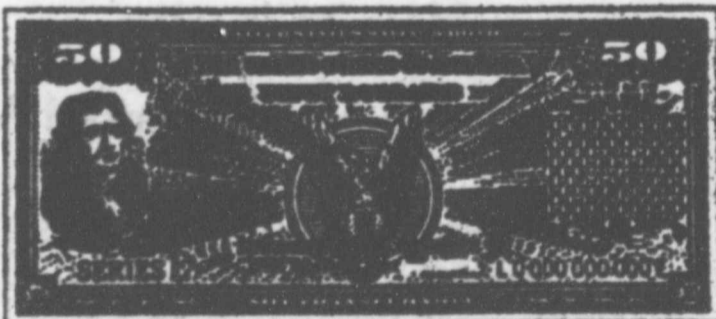
