## W. Floyd Curtis

Funeral services for Walter Floyd Curtis, 65, who passed away Nov. 19 in the VA hospital at San Diego, Calif., were held Monday in the United Methodist Church here by Rev. Weldon Rives. Burial was in Rowe Cemetery near his father, who passed away in 1926.

Floyd was born Feb. 27, 1910 in Denton County, and moved with his parents in 1920 to Hedley, where his mother still resides. He served his country during World War II, going into France on D Day. He remained in this area until the war was over, then spent two years as a volunteer in Germany, assisting in the search for the war dead and their burial. After the war he worked on various ranches in Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and California.

Surviving are his mother, Mrs. Ora Belle Grimsley of Hedley; his stepfather, Ned Grimsley; three sisters, Mrs. Ora Patterson of Lubbock, Mrs. Annie Mae Derrick and Mrs. Flora O'Neal of Amarillo; and a nephew, Jerry Floyd Derrick with the U. S. Navy at Pensacola, Florida.

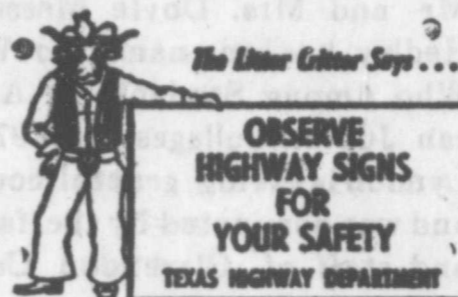

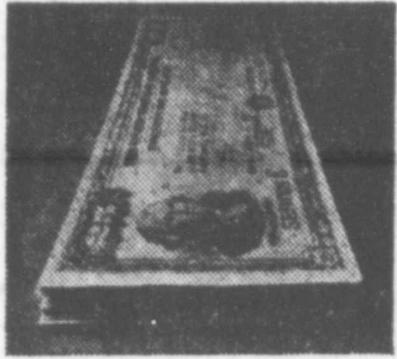

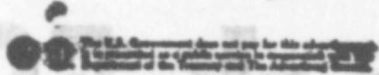
