John Farris was in the Memphis hospital last week.

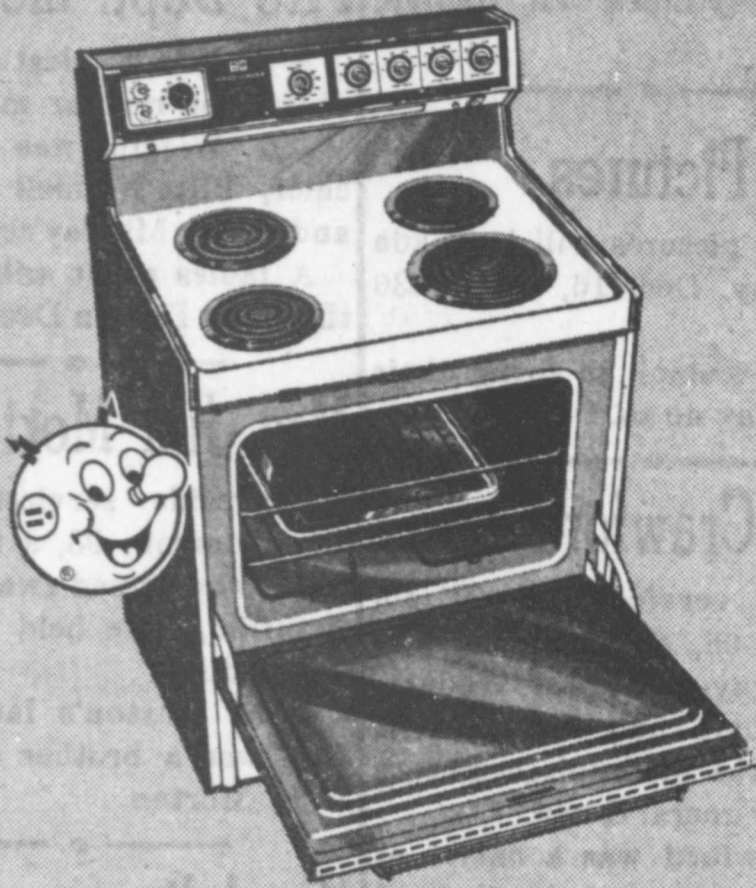
