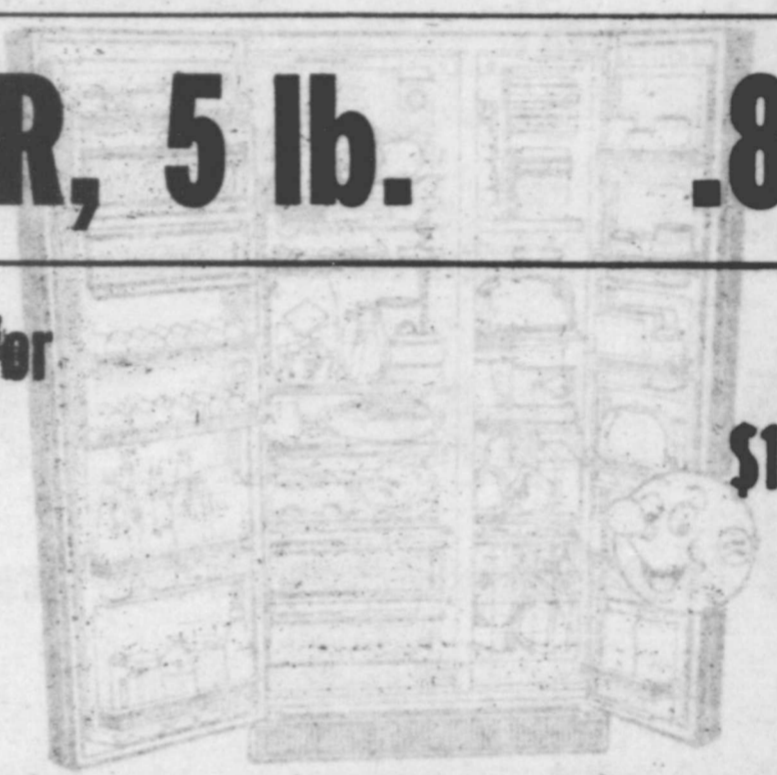

In the regional judging contests at Texas Tech April 10, the Hedley boys had another good day The education dept at the college sponsors several contests, but livestock judging is considered to be the top or No. one contest. In a field of 115 high schools competing the Hedley team placed 7th. They placed fifth in Area one, and this qualifies them to participate in the state contest. Members of this team are Bob White, Michael Darnell and Jimmy Lowe, with Randy Shaw as alternate.

The boys had the 2nd high team in sheep judging with Michael Darnell placing 7th in this phase of the contest. Michael had a perfect score of 100. Bob White was 6th high individual in judging beef cattle. This is the highest placing team that Mr Messer has ever had in livestock judging at Texas Tech.

Dairy cattle judging is considered to be the No 2 contest at the regional judging. The Hedley team of Stuart Messer, John Lemley and Mike Drum made a score of 765 points. This score put the boys No 1 in the Greenbelt District. They needed 30 more points to qualify for state judging. There were 119 high schools participating.

The dairy products team of Joe Lemley, Randy Woodard and Lonnie Brewer, with Mark Brinson alternate, made a very nice showing but did not qualify for state.

Mr. Messer's Quail dairy products team did qualify for state, placing 4th in regional and 2nd in area. Members of this team were David Russell, 4th high individual, Brian Barton, 6th high individual, and Brad Barton as the third member of this team. Russ Mahgum and Harvey Oatman were alternates.

These two teams which qualified will participate in the state judging on April 24.
