## Ag Exemptions

Austin—Comptroller Bob Bullock says his office has rewritten sales tax procedures on agricultural exemptions to make them as easy to read as a mail-order catalog.

The new procedures will be effective about July 15, he said.

The Comptroller said the procedures clarify the fact that the following items are exempt from the sales tax: expendable supplies such as hand tools, baling wire, binders, twine, hardware, tires and lubricants for farm machinery; fences, pens, gates, cattle guards and chutes; and structures that can be considered a piece of equipment, such as automated laying houses and farrowing houses. However, most farm buildings, such as barns, garages, warehouses and family dwellings, are taxable, he said.

Any farmer or rancher seeking an exemption must have an exemption certificate on file with the retailer at the time of purchase.

The Comptroller said that persons needing more information about the new procedure may call the Comptroller's Office toll-free at 1-800-292-9687.

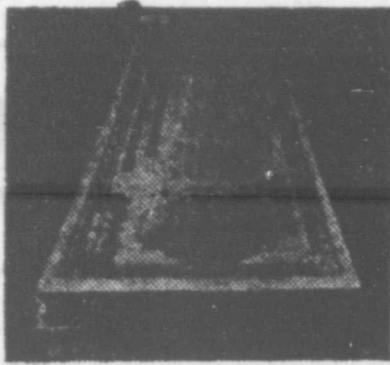

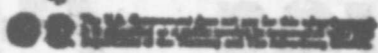

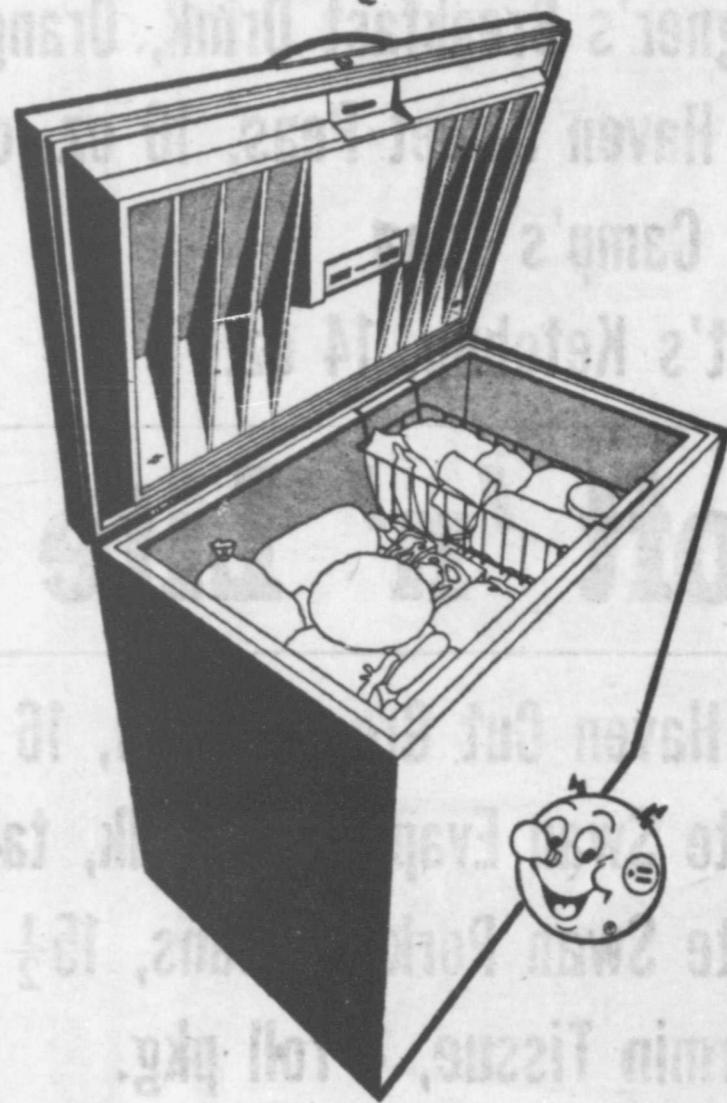

**LOCK IN FLAVOR:** Use moisture and vapor-proof materials especially designed for freezers to wrap your foods. Tightly sealed, these lock in flavor and moisture and prevent "freezer burn" (surface drying) on foods. Don't use wax paper, bread paper or regular cellophane for freezer foods.

**LABEL PACKAGES:** Date and identify freezer packages so (1) you don't accumulate a lot of mysterious shapes and (2) you'll be able to pick out foods that have been in the freezer longest.

**TAKE ADVANTAGE OF SALES:** Avoid overstocking with commercially frozen food that's always available; use your freezer as your own bargain counter and store foods you can buy on sale. But do allow space for short-time baked goods, leftovers and special party foods.

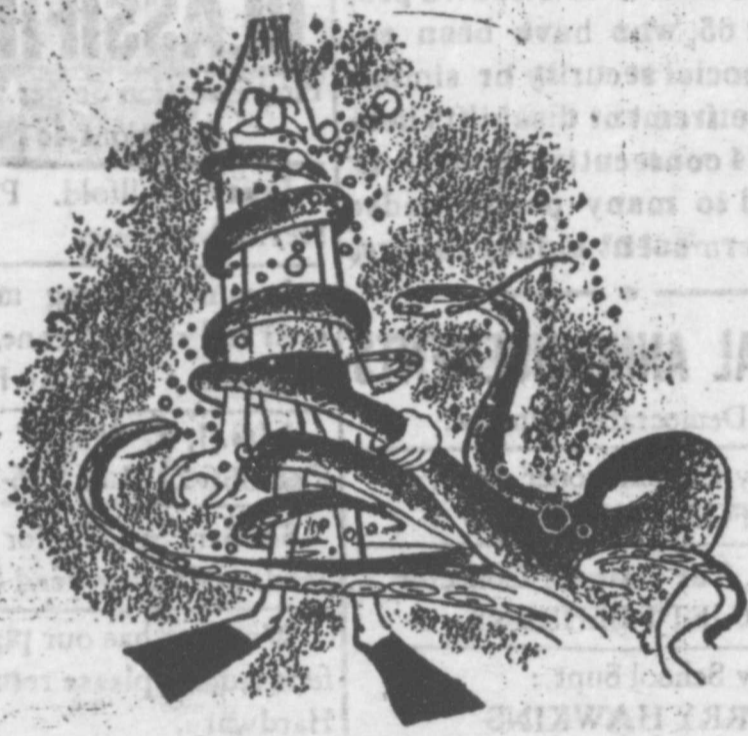

### Medicare To Go Up

Monthly premiums on the medical insurance part of Medicare will go up starting July 1.

The basic premium rate will go from \$6 70 to \$7 20 a month, according to Jim Talbot, social security district manager in Amarillo.

Medicare medical insurance helps pay doctor bills and other medical expenses and is funded by individual premiums and Federal general revenues. The protection is offered to people reaching 65 and over who are eligible for social security or railroad retirement benefits to disabled people under 65 who have been entitled to social security or similar railroad retirement disability benefits for 24 consecutive months or more, and to many people under 65 with permanent kidney failure.

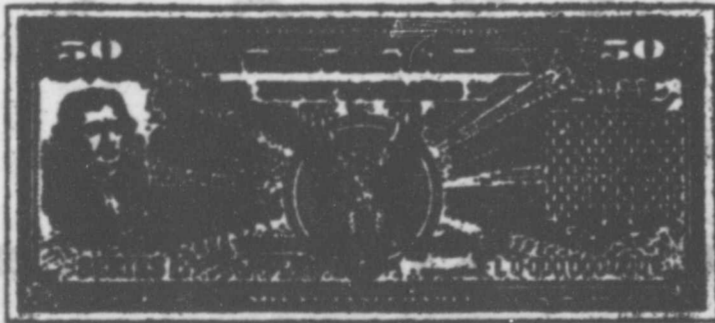
