School Lunch Program Register To Vote

The Hedley Schools teday abnounced its policy for free and reduced lunches for children unable to pay the full price for meals served under the National School Lunch Program!

Children from families whose Income meets those indicated on the attached charts are eligible for free meals. In, addition, families not meeting those crireria but with other unusual expenses due to unusually high medical expeness, shelter costs in excess of 30% of income, special education expenses due to the mertal or physical condition of a child, and disaster casualty losses are urged to apply

Application forms will be given to students when they enroll in classes. Additional copies are available at the principal's officel The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining elipibility Applies tions may be submitted at any time during the year

In certain cases foster children are wlso eligible for these benefits If a family has foster children liv ing with them and wish to apply for free meals you should contact the school

In the operation of this program no child will be discriminated against because of race, bex, color or national origin.

Under the provisions of the polioy the school will review all appli cations and determine eligibility.
