Joint School and City Election

There will be a joint school and city election in the Hedley Lions Den on Saturday, April 2.

There will be two to elect for the school board for three years. Members whose terms expire this year are Martha Hill and H. E. Darbush.

There will be three aldermen to elect for the city, two for two year terms and one for one year. Aldermen whose terms expire this year are C. L. Taylor, Bill Wadsworth and W. B. Wiggins.

Any qualified citizen may run for these offices. Candidates for the school board should see Supt. Vernon Scott and candidates for the City Council should see City Secretary M. O. Weatherly.

Deadline to file for these offices is March 2.

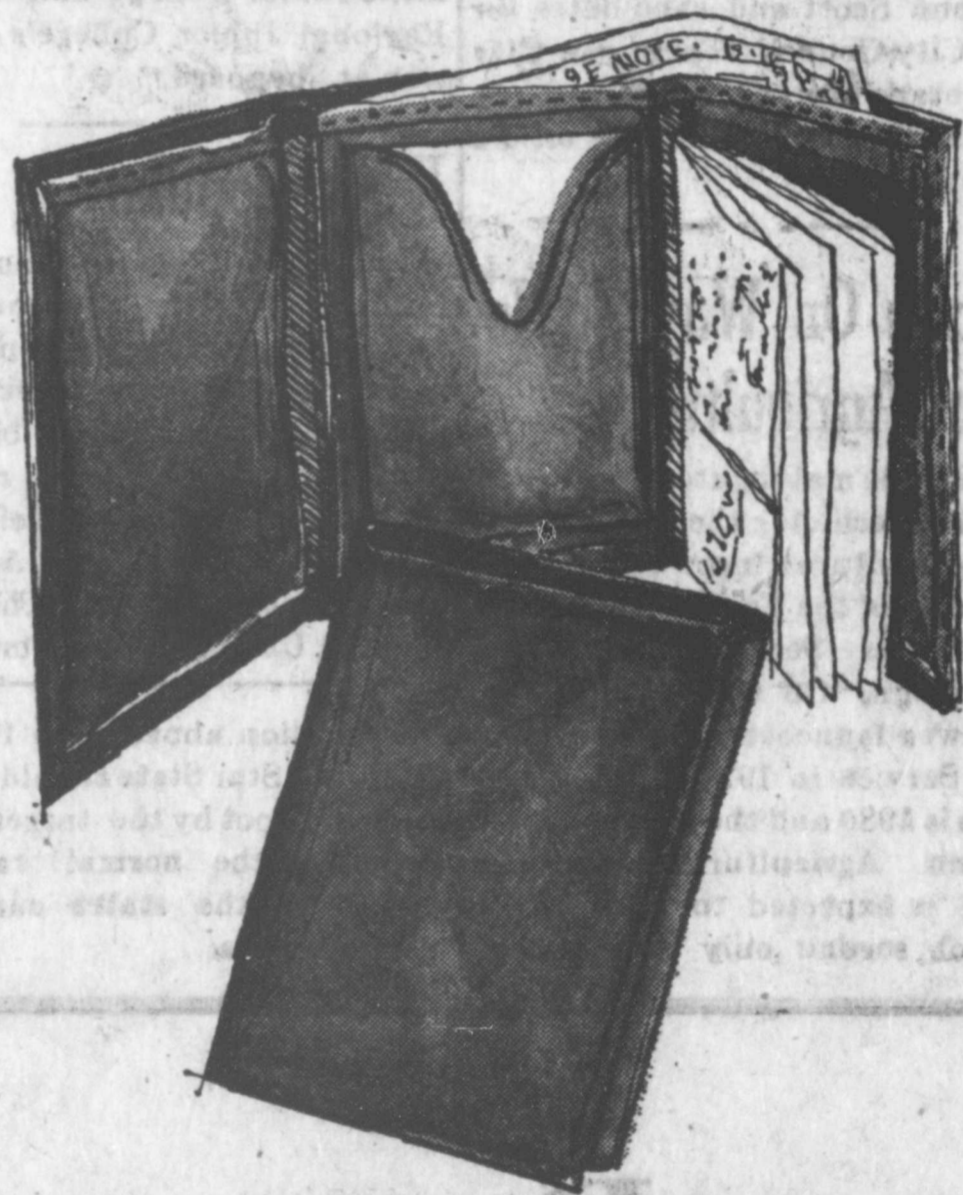

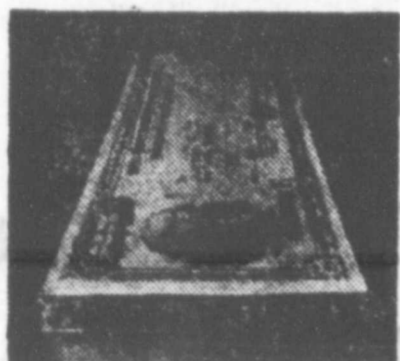

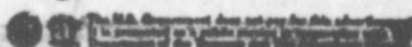
