There will be a joint school and city election at the Hedley Lions Den on Saturday, April 2, also an election to determine if the offices of Sheriff and County Tax Assessor and Collector should be separated.

Management Key Farm Ponds

Management is the main ingredient to top fish producing farm ponds, says a fisheries specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. For farm ponds to reach their potential in fish production, such things as proper location, dam construction, stocking and feeding of fish are vital. Good management includes removing unfit or undesirable fish, controlling weeds and providing places for fish to spawn. Use of brush and automobile tires will help concentrate fish to make fishing more successful.

Breakeven Costs Key To Profits

Texas farmers need to take a close look at breakeven costs in planning for optimum crop profits says an economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Breakeven costs for variable expenses vary with specific regions but average 28 cents a pound for cotton, \$2.21 per 100 pounds of sorghum, \$1.88 per bushel of wheat and \$1.62 per bushel of corn. Total production costs average 47 cents for cotton, \$3.80

for sorghum, \$3.37 for wheat and \$2.62 for corn. By comparing income above variable costs per acre for each crop, a producer can select a combination of crops for optimum income.

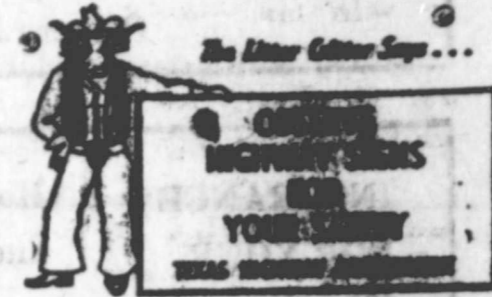
