## Management Key To Farm Ponds

Management is the main ingredient to top fish producing farm ponds, says a fisheries specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. For farm ponds to reach their potential in fish production, such things as proper location, dam construction, stocking and feeding of fish are vital. Good management includes removing unfit or undesirable fish, controlling weeds and providing places for fish to spawn. Use of brush and automobile tires will help concentrate fish to make fishing more successful.

## Breakeven Costs Key To Profits

Texas farmers ought to take a close look at breakeven costs in planning for optimum crop profits, says an economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. 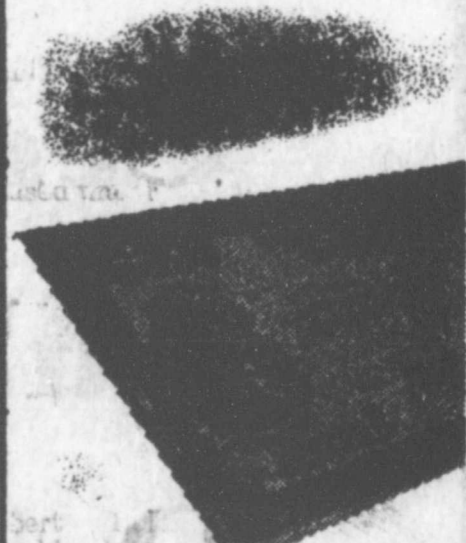

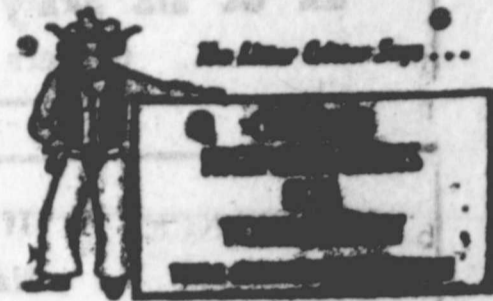
