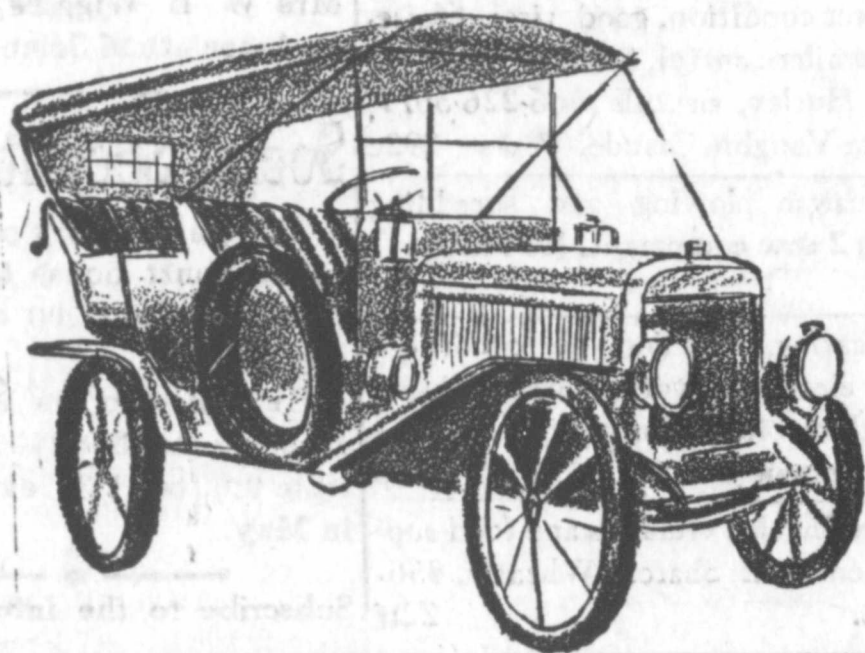

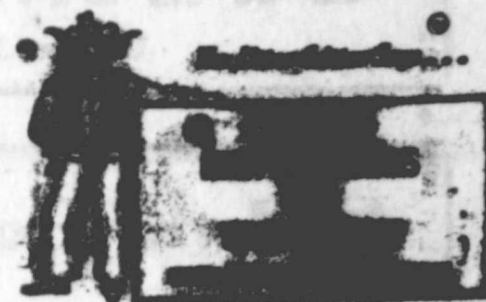

A Social Security parade will be at the court house in Clarendon from 9:15 to 12:00 every Thursday in May.

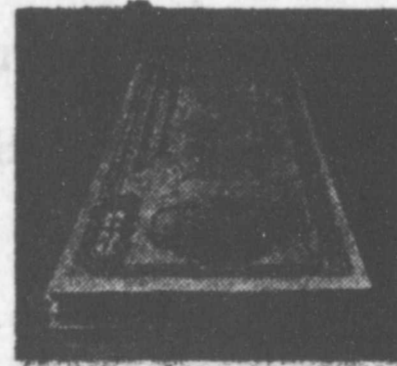
