Breakeven Costs Key To Profits

Texas farmers need to take a close look at breakeven costs in planning for optimum crop profits says an economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Breakeven costs for variable expenses vary with specific regions but average 28 cents a pound for cotton, \$2.21 per 100 pounds of sorghum, \$1.88 per bushel of wheat and \$1.62 per bushel of corn. Total production costs average 47 cents for cotton, \$3.80 for sorghum, \$3.37 for wheat and \$2.62 for corn. By comparing income above variable costs per acre for each crop, a producer can select a combination of crops for optimum income.

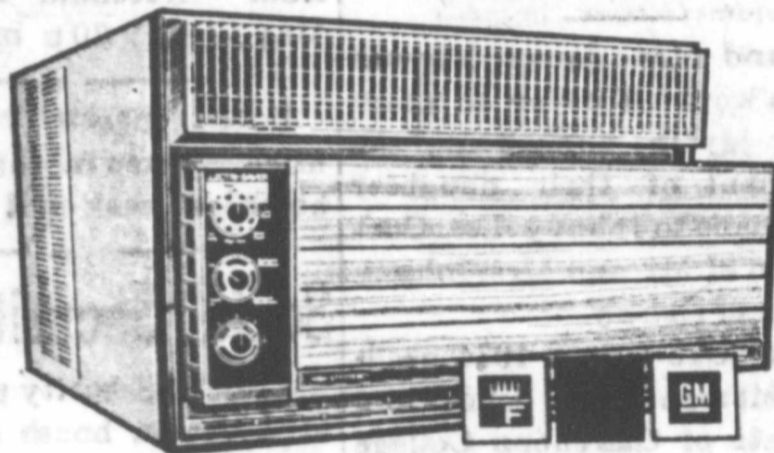
