Schedule of Summer Homemaking Classes

The schedule of classes to be offered in the Hedley school during June follows:

May 30 through June 3, 8:30 to 11 a. m.; assistance with special problems relating to foods, clothing, furniture, accessories, etc. 2:00 to 5:00 p. m.; student classes in clothing construction.

June 6 to 10, 8:30 to 11 a. m.; adult and student class in construction of the basic T-shirt and variations, demonstration type class with some work done in dept. if desired. Bring supplies for individual project. 2 to 5 p. m.; furniture repair and upholstery for adults. Each person to furnish supplies for his or her piece of furniture. Contact Sus Shields for help with fabric necessary.

June 13 to 17, 2 to 5 p. m.; handcrafts, needlepoint, crewel embroidery, knit, crochet, etc. Bring supplies for type of handcraft in which interested. Suggested supplies: needlepoint canvas and yarn size to fill square of canvas, 10 sq. to inch of good size needles to carry yarn, coarse fabric for crewel embroidery, crewel needles and yarn. For knitting, 4 ply yarn and size 8 or 9 needles, crochet hook size G to I, yarn to fit hook. A small inexpensive kit may be used for any of these handcrafts or practice may be done to learn various stitches of the different crafts.

Survey To Be Made

A survey will be made in Hedley shortly as to how many low income persons would be interested in low rent housing, also possible material for insulating homes. This would come through Parklands Community Act.

Rev. Lewis Ellis is chairman of the survey committee, which also includes Ray Altman, Vertha Hinds and Mrs. Martha Hill.

Breakeven Costs Key To Profits

Texas farmers need to take a close look at breakeven costs in planning for optimum crop profits, says an economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Breakeven costs for variable expenses vary with specific regions but average 28 cents a pound for cotton, \$2.21 per 100 pounds of sorghum, \$1.88 per bushel of wheat and \$1.62 per bushel of corn. Total production costs average 47 cents for cotton, \$3.89 for sorghum, \$3.37 for wheat and \$2.62 for corn. By comparing income above variable costs per acre for each crop, a producer can select a combination of crops for optimum income.

Management Key To Farm Ponds

Management is the main ingredient to top fish producing farm ponds, says a fisheries specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. For farm ponds to reach their potential in fish production, such things as proper location, dam construction, stocking and feeding of fish are vital. Good management includes removing up to 50 percent of the fish, controlling weeds and providing places for fish to spawn. Use of brush and automobile tires will help obstruct fish to take fishing more successful.

Breakeven Costs Key To Profits

Texas farmers need to take a close look at breakeven costs in planning for optimum crop profits says an economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Breakeven costs for variable expenses vary with specific regions but average 28 cents a pound for cotton, \$2.21 per 100 pounds of sorghum, \$1.88 per bushel of wheat and \$1.62 per bushel of corn. 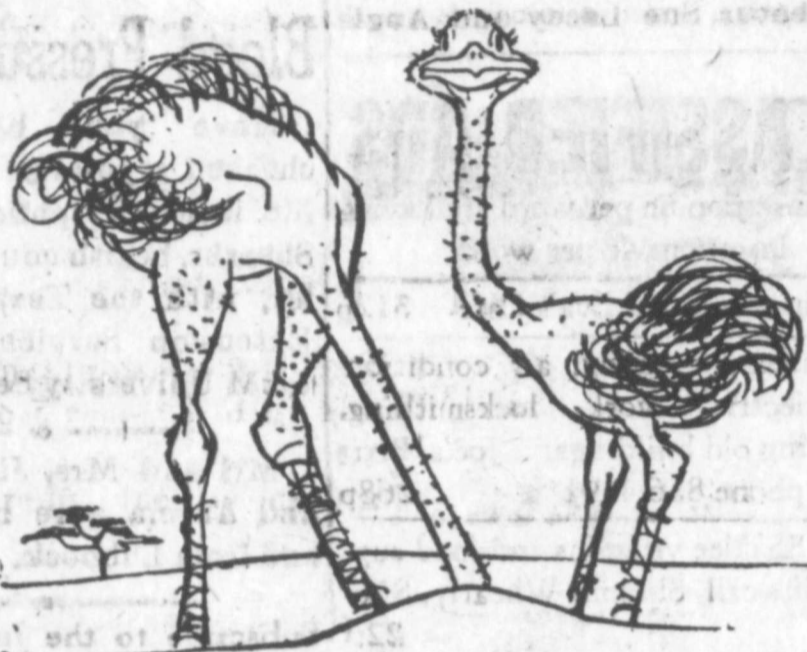

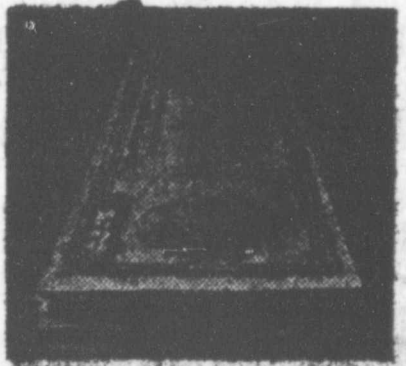
