Schedule of Summer Homemaking Classes

The schedule of classes to be offered in the Hedley school during June follows:

May 30 through June 3, 8:30 to 11 a.m.; assistance with special problems relating to foods, clothing, furniture, accessories, etc. 2:00 to 5:00 p.m.; student classes in clothing construction.

June 6 to 10, 8:30 to 11 a.m.; adult and student class in construction of the basic T-shirt and variations, demonstration type class with some work done in dept. if desired. Bring supplies for individual project. 2 to 5 p.m.; furniture repair and upholstery for adults. Each person to furnish supplies for his or her piece of furniture. Contact Sue Shields for help with fabric necessary.

June 13 to 17, 2 to 5 p.m.; handcrafts, needlepoint, crewel embroidery, knit, crochet, etc. Bring supplies for type of handcraft in which interested. Suggested supplies: needlepoint canvas and yarn size to fill squares of canvas, 10 sq. to inch of grid size, needles to carry yarn, coarse fabric for crewel embroidery, crewel needles and yarn. For knitting, 4 ply yarn and size 8 or 9 needles, wooden hook size G to I, yarn to fit hook. A small inexpensive kit may be used for any of these handcrafts or practice may be done to learn various stitches of the different crafts.

Referendum

Cattlemen in Texas will find out the nation will soon have an opportunity to register and then vote on whether or not they want a new research and promotion program for the beef industry. Producers interested in voting on the referendum must first register during June 6-17 at their local ASCS offices. They will then be able to vote at the ASCS offices, between July 5-15.

At least 50 per cent of the cattle owners who register must vote in order for the referendum to be valid, and two-thirds of those voting must vote affirmatively for the program to carry. The Texas Agricultural Extension Service in each of the other states, has been assisting with educational meetings on the upcoming referendum as it is charged with the educational responsibility to provide facts about the proposed program.

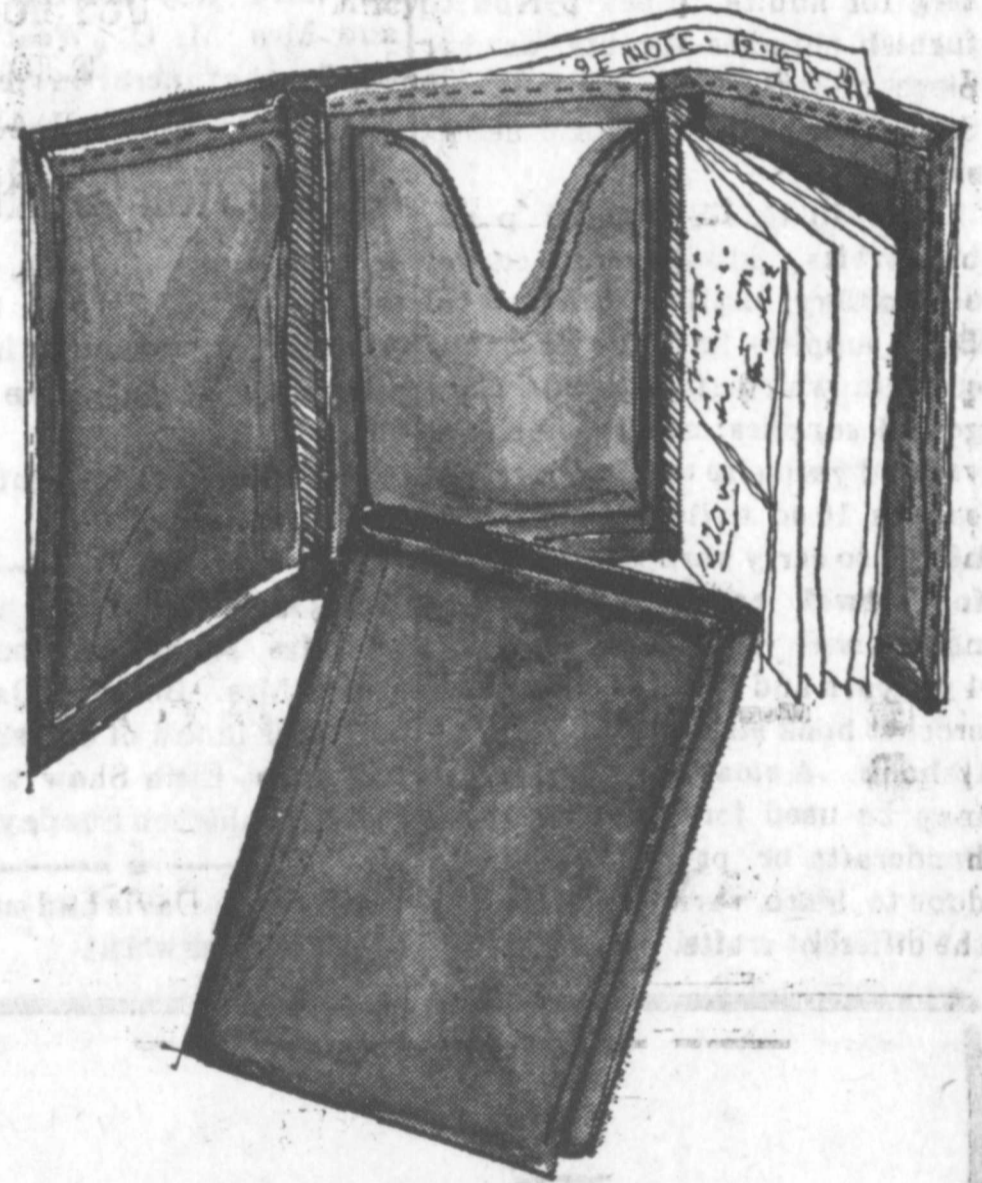

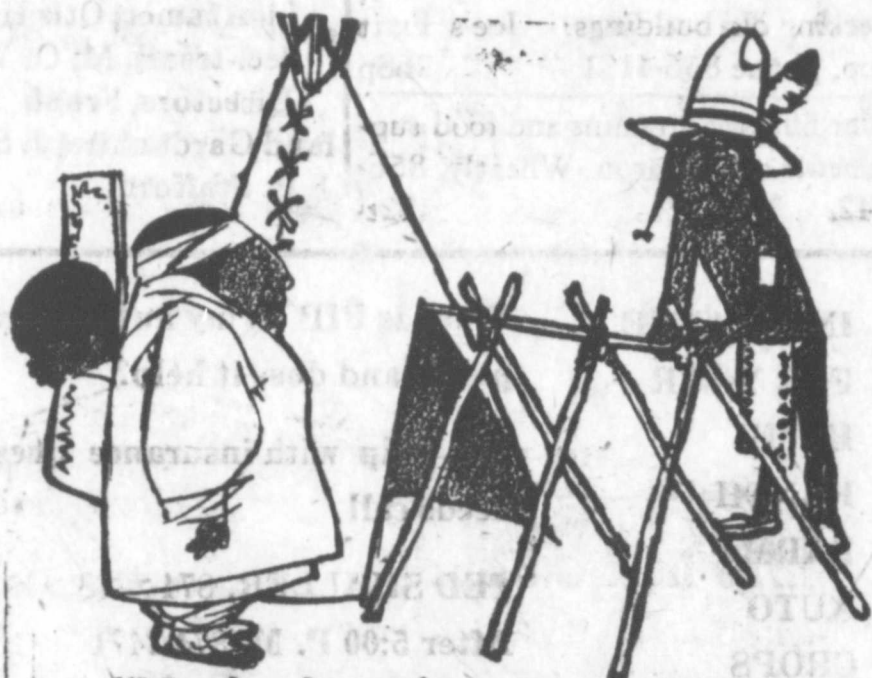
