Schedule of Summer Homemaking Classes

The schedule of classes to be offered in the Hedley school during June follows:

May 30 through June 3, 8:30 to 11 a. m.; assistance with special problems relating to foods, clothing, furniture, accessories, etc. 2:00 to 5:00 p. m.; student classes in clothing construction.

June 6 to 10, 8:30 to 11 a. m.; adult and student class in construction of the basic T-shirt and variations, demonstration type class with some work done in dept. if desired. Bring supplies for individual projects. 2 to 5 p. m.; furniture repair and upholstery for adults. Each person to furnish supplies for his or her piece of furniture. Contact Sue Shields for help with fabric necessary.

June 13 to 17, 2 to 5 p. m.; handcrafts, needlepoint, crocheted embroidery, knit, crochet, etc. Bring supplies for type of handcraft in which interested. Suggested supplies: needlepoint canvas and yarn size to fill square of canvas, 10 sq. to inch of good size needles to carry yarn, coarse fabric for crocheted embroidery, crocheted needles and yarn. For knitting, 4 ply yarn and size 8 or 9 needles, crocheted hook size G to I, yarn to fit hook. A small inexpensive kit may be used for any of these handcrafts or practice may be done to learn various stitches of the different crafts.

Hot Summer Could Raise Electric Bills

A long hot summer could produce some of the highest electric bills in years. West Texas Utilities Co. officials warned this week.

And according to some weather observers, official and otherwise, a hot summer is long overdue. West Texas, like much of the nation, has enjoyed five relatively cool summers in a row. The law of averages therefore, would indicate a change.

One of the consequences would be more use of air conditioning, requiring more electric energy. This could run bills up sharply.

There already are indications that customers may soon be jolted out of their summer lull. During the first 21 days of May, temperatures in Abilene averaged 58.1 degrees above normal and electric usage went up accordingly.

Referendum

Cattlemen in Texas and through out the nation will soon have an opportunity to register and then vote on whether or not they want a new setback and prohibition program for the beef industry. Producers interested in voting on the referendum must first register during June 6-17 at their local ASCS offices. They will then be able to vote also at the ASCS offices, between July 5-15.

At least 50 per cent of the cattle owners who register must vote in order for the referendum to be valid, and two-thirds of those voting must vote affirmatively for the program to carry. The Texas Agricultural Extension Service in each of the other states, has been assisting with educational meetings on the upcoming referendum as it is charged with the educational responsibility to present facts about the proposed program.

Texas 6th In Nation In Poultry Industry

Cash receipts from poultry and eggs in Texas totaled \$375.2 million last year, up \$32 million from 1975. That was good enough to rank the state sixth in the U. S. poultry industry, says a poultry marketing specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Texas receipts accounted for 5.33 per cent of the national total of more than \$7 billion in 1976. On a commodity basis, Texas was sixth in turkey production, ninth in egg production and seventh in broiler production. Per capita egg consumption continued to decline last year while broiler and turkey consumption was up, the largest on record.
