Hot Summer Could Raise Electric Bills

A long hot summer could produce some of the highest electric bills in years. West Texas Utilities Co. officials warned this week.

And according to some weather observers, official and otherwise, a hot summer is long overdue. West Texas, like much of the nation, has enjoyed five relatively cool summers in a row. The law of averages, therefore, would indicate a change.

One of the consequences would be more use of air conditioning, requiring more electric energy. This could run bills up sharply.

There already are indications that customers may soon be jolted out of their summer lull. During the first 21 days of May, temperatures in Abilene averaged 58.1 degrees above normal and electric usage went up accordingly.

Texas 6th In Nation In Poultry Industry

Referendum

Cattlemen in Texas and throughout the nation will soon have an opportunity to register and then vote on whether or not they want a new regulation and production program for the beef industry.

Products introduced in voting on the referendum must first register during June 6-17 at their local ASCS offices. They will then be able to vote also at the ASCS offices between July 5-15.

At least 50 per cent of the cattle owners who register must vote in order for the referendum to be valid, and two-thirds of those voting must vote affirmatively for the program to carry.

The Texas Agricultural Extension Service in each of the other states, has been assisting with educational meetings to the upcoming referendum as it is charged with the educational responsibility to present facts about the proposed program.

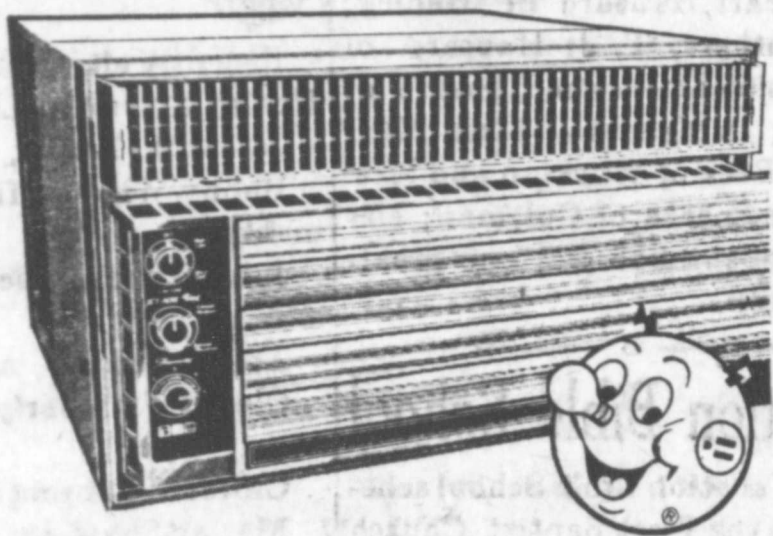

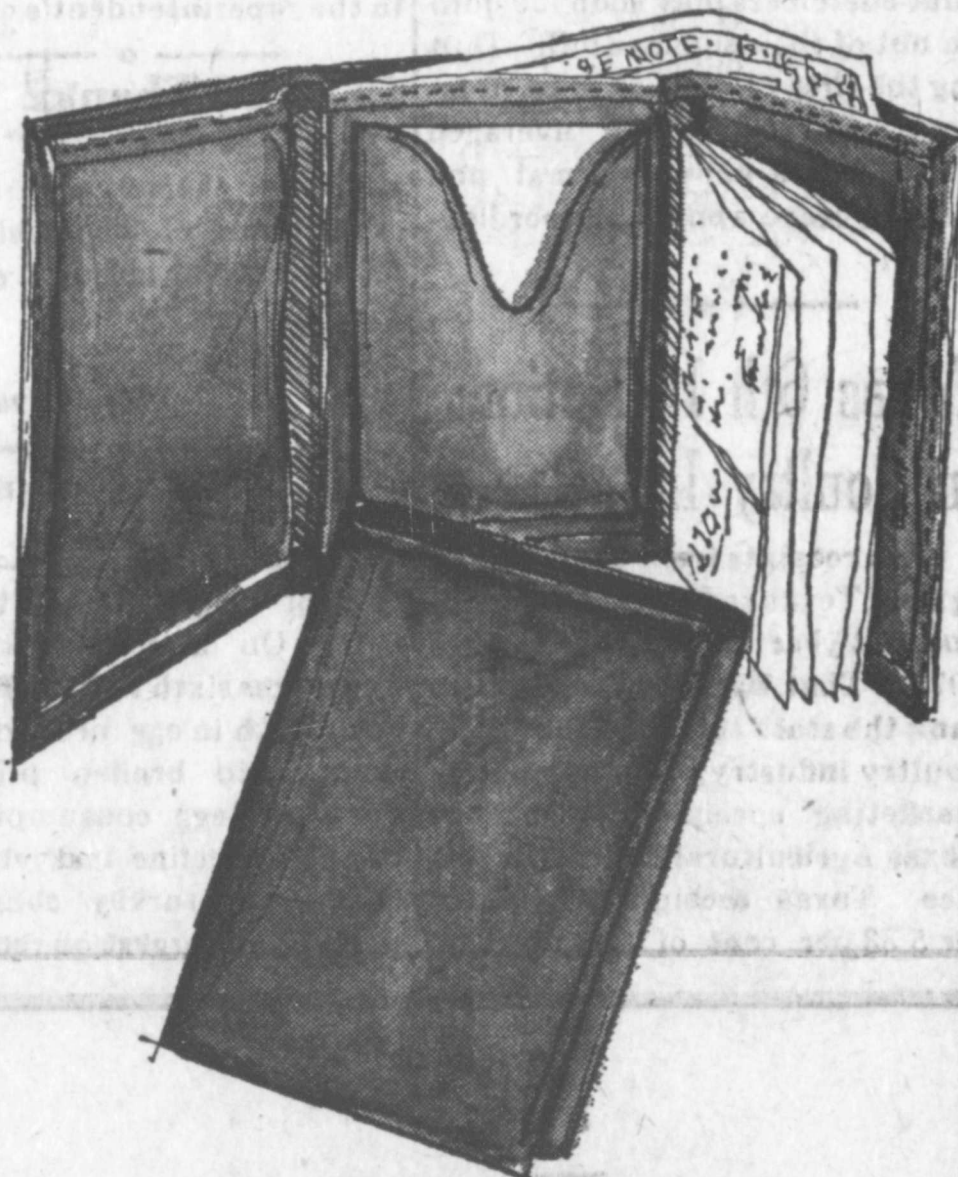
