The Social Security Administration District Office in Amarillo has received reports from the public that they are being contacted by a man who is falsely representing himself as an employee of the Social Security Administration, reports Jim Talbot, District Manager. "He uses the guise of one of our employees and tells the people that if they are receiving Supplemental Security Income, they are now required to pay eight dollars a month just to receive SSI," says Talbot. "Those who are on SSI are in no way obligated to pay a fee for receiving these benefits."

## Fire Danger

Austin—Because of the very dry conditions of rangeland in several parts of the state, Agriculture Commissioner Reagan V. Brown warns summer travelers and campers that carelessness could easily trigger costly and dangerous range fires.

Brown said that vast areas of valuable rangeland could be turned into wasteland "in a matter of minutes" by cigarettes or matches thoughtlessly thrown from vehicles or by unattended campfires.

### Storm Warning

Since the tornado season is with us again, it is time to remind everyone of the signals sounded by the fire siren. One blast of the siren indicates a fire, two blasts are to call the department together, and three blasts indicate a storm.

Three blasts do not necessarily indicate that a tornado has been sighted but they do mean that everyone should watch the clouds and take whatever action seems to be necessary.

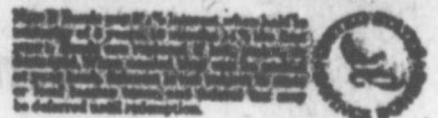
