Fire Danger

Another—Because of the very dry conditions of rangeland in several parts of the state, Agriculture Commissioner Reagan V. Brown warns summer travelers and campers that carelessness could easily trigger costly and dangerous range fires.

Brown said that vast areas of valuable rangeland could be turned into wasteland "in a matter of minutes" by cigarettes or matches thoughtlessly thrown from vehicles or by unattended campfires.

"He uses the guise of one of our employees and tells the people that if they are receiving Supplemental Security Income, they are now required to pay eight dollars a month just to receive SSI," says Talbot. "Those who are on SSI are in no way obligated to pay a fee for receiving these benefits."

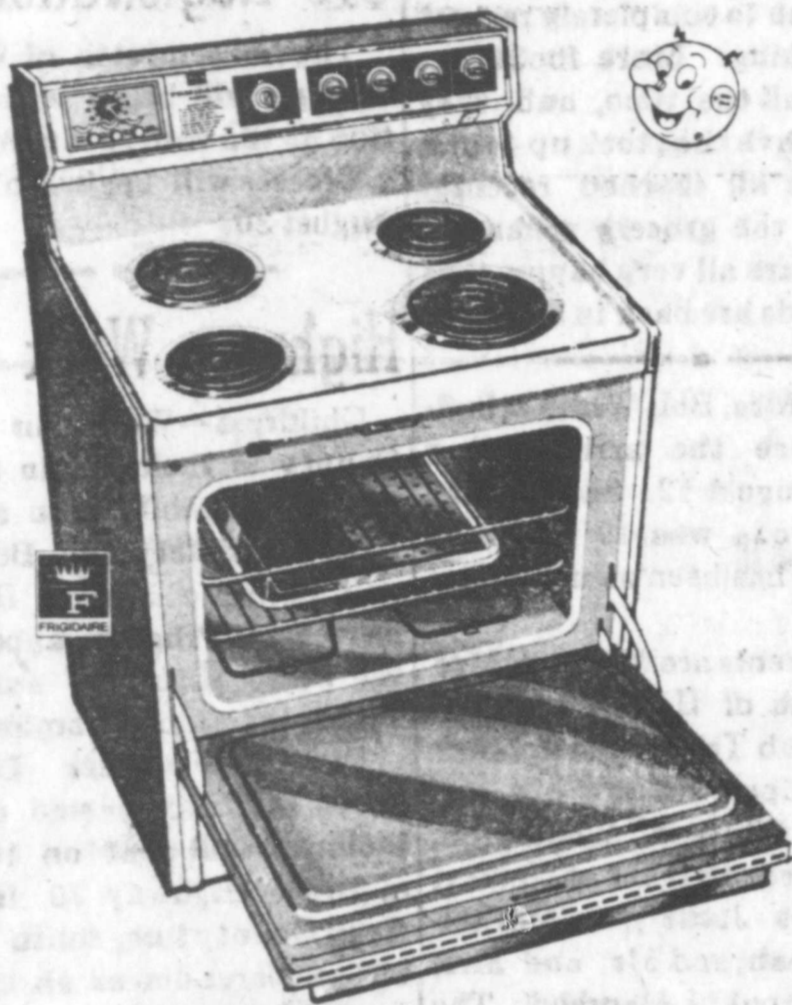

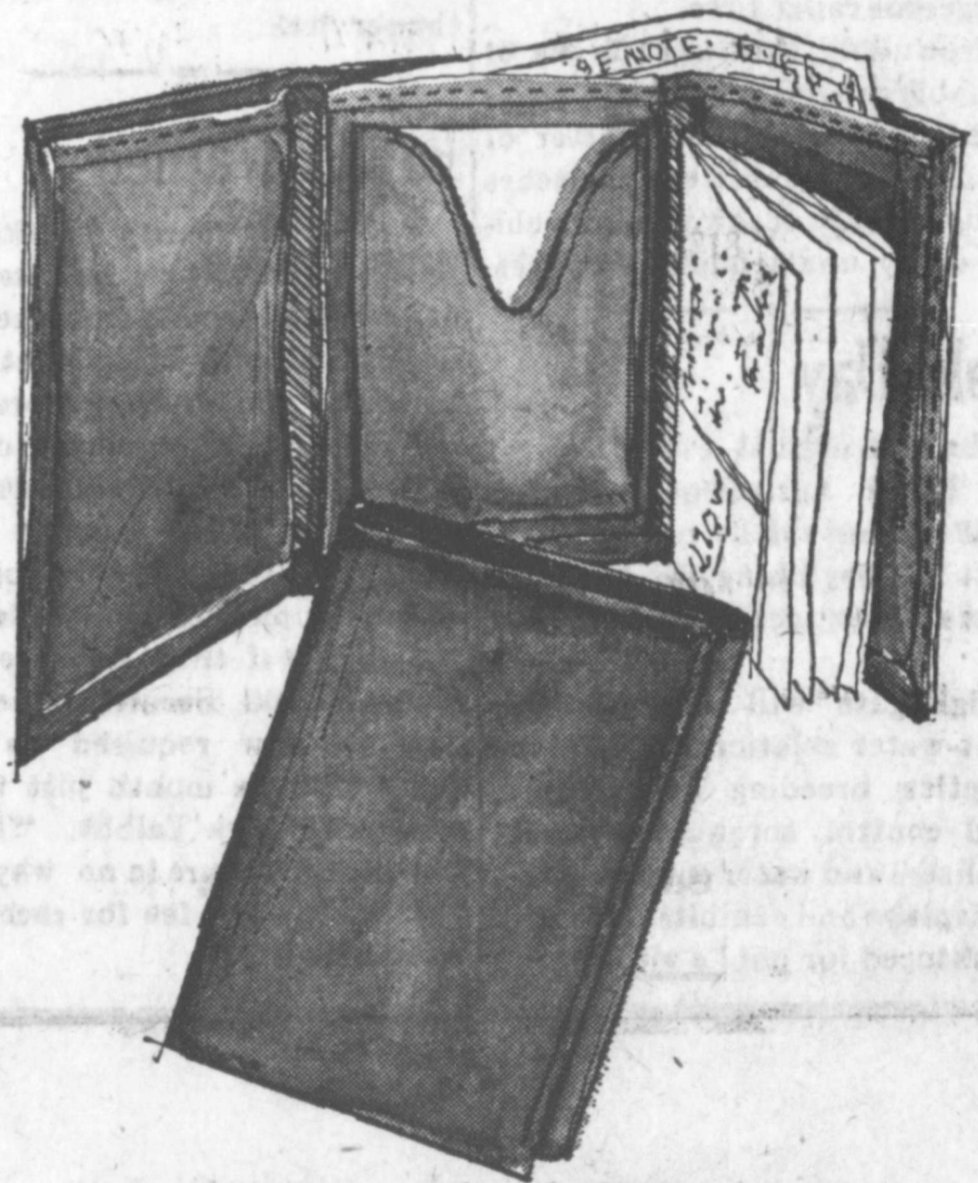
