Fire Danger

Austin—Because of the very dry conditions of rangeland in several parts of the state, Agriculture Commissioner Rangel V. Brown warns summer travelers and campers that carelessness could easily trigger costly and dangerous range fires.

Brown said that vast areas of valuable rangeland could be turned into wasteland "in a matter of minutes" by cigarettes or matches thoughtlessly thrown from vehicles or by unattended campfires.




