Meat Imports Down

Imports of foreign meat during the first six months of 1977 fell considerably below a year ago—down 81 million pounds or 12 percent, notes a livestock marketing specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Beef and veal imports were down 14 percent, lamb imports were off 28 percent, and pork imports were down 4 percent. Imports of live cattle increased 12 percent during the same six months period while sheep imports fell 82 percent.

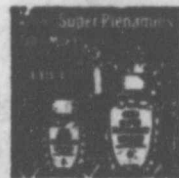

The Self-Study Planning Procedure is a process that every school district in the state must apply to maintain its accredited status. The self-study requires approximately two years.

The status of Hedley ISD at this time is:

A We have adopted district wide goals and goal indicators. These have been approved by the Hedley ISD Steering Committee, Hedley ISD Board of Trustees, and Texas Education Agency.

B In November of 1977 we completed the curriculum area phase of the self-study.

C In January 1978 we will begin our major areas of study.

The complete results of the self-study will be studied by the Hedley ISD Steering Committee at a later date and the complete results will be published.
