Beef Short Course Offered Feb. 13-16

A beef production short course for adult farmers will be held Feb. 13 through 16 under the sponsorship of the Hedley High School Ag. Dept., according to Supr. Vernon Scott and Ag teacher Doyle Messer.

Dr. Richard C. Thomas, beef production specialist with the Voc. Ag. division of the Texas Education Agency and the Dept. of Animal Science at Texas A&M, will be the instructor. He is headquartered at Texas A&M.

Dr. Thomas has a strong background in animal production and genetics. He received his BS and MS degrees from Texas A&M and his Ph.D. from Iowa State. For the past seven years he was in charge of the beef cattle research at the Experiment Station at McGregor. He directly supervised the nutrition, health, and reproduction programs used there.

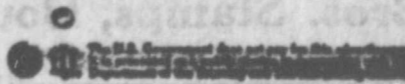

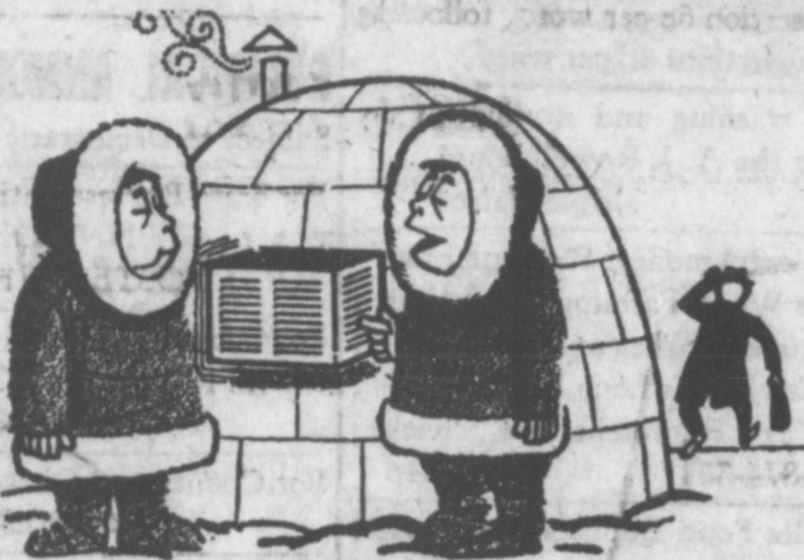
