School Tax Valuations Are Raised

The School Board of Hedley ISD has decided to use 100% of value as a basis for levying taxes for the year 1978 instead of 40.8% as previously used.

Anyone wishing to meet with the Equalization Board for discussion is invited to do so. Date for the meeting has been set for May 1st from 6 to 9 p. m.

The rate will be lowered from last year's \$2.00 per \$100, but the exact amount has not yet been determined.
