For county judge, Hinds had 193, Christal 30 and Nease 20. Over the county Hinds had 631, Christal 521 and Nease 327. For tax assessor collector, McCowan had 112, Moffitt 62 and Hommel 56. Over the county Hommel had 583, McCowan 542 and Moffitt 372. For treasurer, Dale had 112, Williams 60 and Bobbitt 50. Over the county Dale had 626, Williams 439 and Bobbitt 425. Referendum 1 was voted down 11 to 148. No 2 was also voted down 82 to 122.

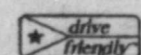

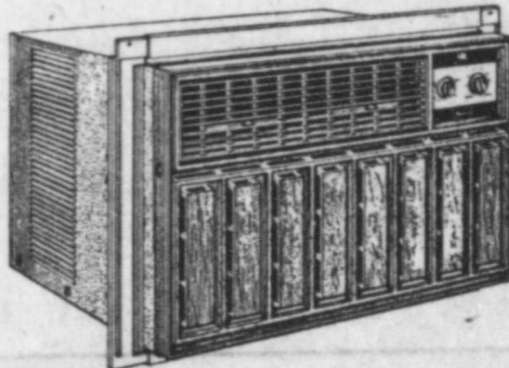

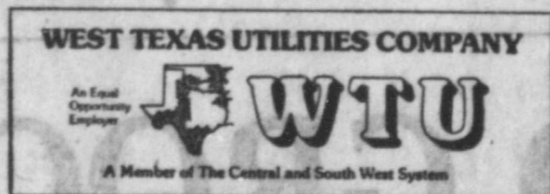
