## To Issue Biography Of Cal C. Wright

"With God in the Light," a biography of one of the major figures in Northwest Texas Methodism, the late Cal C. Wright, will be published June 1, by McMurry College Books.

The life of "Brother Cal" was written by Dr. Joseph D. Stimesy, chairman of the McMurry College philosophy department. The 164 page volume contains both illustrations by artist Shari Borke and photographs.

Wright served as pastor of the Hedley United Methodist Church from 1917 to 1920.

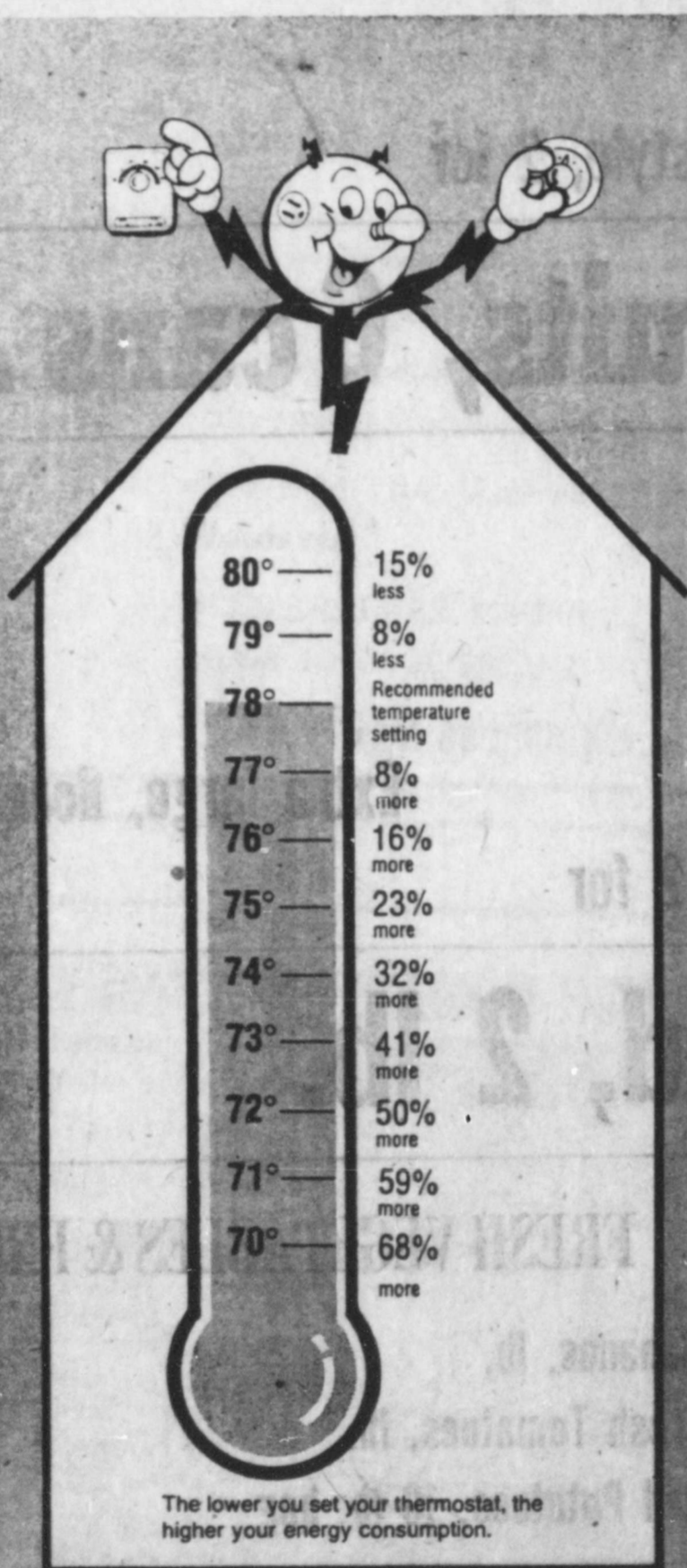

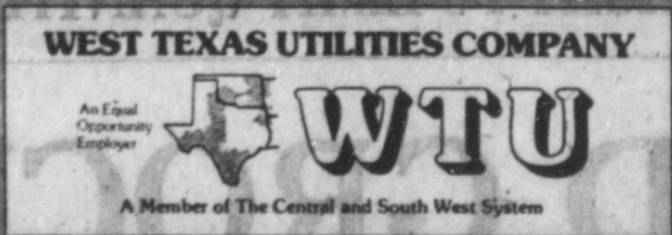


