

# Sets Director

The election for a Parmer County Soil and Water Conservation board director has been set for Tuesday, October 10 at 10 a.m. at Friona State Bank.

Troy Christian has held a position on the board representing Subdivision-four for 18 years. He has decided not to run again this term due to other obligations.

"Please feel free to stop by Friona State Bank at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, October 10 and place your vote. If anyone would like to run for the position, they are welcome," a SWCD representative stated.

The following are eligibility rules for voting and

candidacy: State law decrees that to be eligible to vote in a Soil and Water Conservation District director election, a person must own agricultural land within the district where the election is being held. The person must also live in a county all or part of which is in the district and the voter must be eighteen years of age or older.

Legal qualifications state that a candidate for the office of a Soil and Water Conservation District must own land in the subdivision he or she represents, be 18 years of age or older and be actively engaged in farming or ranching. The candidate must also live in a county all or part of which is in the district. Soil and Water Conservation District directors serve four year terms of office.

Zone 3 of the district includes all land in the south Friona School District.

Current members of the board of directors of the Parmer County Soil and Water Conservation District are M.C. Osborn, chairman; Troy Christian, vice chairman; Kevin Welch, secretary; Mike Beauchamp, member;

and Mike Miller, member. The purpose of the Parmer County Soil and Water Conservation District with headquarters in Friona is to promote sound soil and water conservation programs on agricultural lands within the district and to serve as a voice for farmers, ranchers and local community entities on conservation matters.

The district board of directors coordinate the conservation efforts of various local, state and federal agencies and other organizations. The district has the authority to enter into working agreements with these governmental agencies and private concerns to carry out its purposes.

All conservation programs managed by the district are of a voluntary nature to the landowner or operator or other potential users of the S.W.C.D.'s programs.

The 1988 Floyd graduate was a member of his school's New Mexico state champion basketball teams that went to the state playoffs three years, finishing first twice and third once.


